









#### ENROLLMENT HISTORY -HEADCOUNT








#### ENROLLMENT HISTORY - FTE











#### **ATTAINMENT GOAL METRICS - ACCESS**








Three-year college going rate for underrepresented Utah high school graduates. Percent share for SLCC compared to USHE institutional average; 2017 - 2022.














The College follows Utah Board of Higher Education Policy P562 recommending 4-7% of the budget be held in carry-forward, non-lapsing balances.


SLCC Non-lapsing Balance Amount: \$11,493,624 or 6%

# DEGREE GRANTING: Tuition & Fees Overview






No tuition increase other than 25% compensation in a decade.
