

## **2009-2010 Athletic Student Right to Know**

### **TOTAL COHORT**

Beginning the Fall Semester of the 2006 Academic Year, 1909 first-time full-time students attended Salt Lake Community College, of which 941 were male and 968 were female students. In addition, of the 941 male and 968 female students, there were 621 white males and 665 white females; 104 Hispanic males and 111 Hispanic females; 51 Asian/Pacific Islander males and 60 Asian/Pacific Islander females; 37 black males and 20 black females, 22 American Indian/Alaskan Native males, 15 American Indian/Alaskan Native females, 20 non-resident alien males and 24 nonresident alien females; and 159 students with race/ethnicity unknown, of which 86 were males and 73 were females.

### **ATHLETIC COHORTS**

#### **MALE SPORTS**

##### Baseball

There were a total of 16 first-time full time students participating in baseball. Of these students, 14 were white, 1 was Asian, and 1 was Pacific Islander. Sixteen were on scholarships related to their participation in the baseball program. Of the 16 students receiving athletic aid, 5 white students graduated, 4 white students and 1 Asian student went on missions, and 5 white students and 1 Pacific Islander transferred.

##### Basketball

There were a total of 7 first-time full-time students participating in basketball. Of the 7 students, 4 were white and 3 were black. All 7 students were on scholarships related to their participation in the basketball program. Of the 7 students receiving athletic aid, 3 white students and 1 black student graduated, 1 white student went on a mission, and 2 black students transferred.

#### **FEMALE SPORTS**

##### Basketball

There were a total of 6 first-time full-time students participating in basketball. Of the 6 students, 5 were white and 1 student was Pacific Islander. All six students were on scholarships related to their participation in the basketball program. Of the 6 students receiving athletic aid, 4 white students graduated, 1 white student transferred, and 1 Pacific Islander graduated.

##### All Other Sports

There were a total of 18 first-time full-time students participating in volleyball and softball. Of the 18 students, all were on scholarships related to their participation in the volleyball and softball programs. Of the 18 students receiving athletic aid, 15 were white and 3 were non-resident aliens. Eleven white students graduated, 3 non-resident aliens graduated, 3 white students transferred and one left the institution.
