Beginning the Fall Semester of the 2014 Academic Year, 1,538 first-time, full-time students attended Salt Lake Community College, of which 812 were male and 726 were female students. These 1,538 students identified themselves as the following race/ethnicity:

MALE SPORTS

Baseball

There were a total of 24 first-time, full-time students participating in baseball. Of these students, 20 were white, 3 were Hispanic, and 1 was African American. Twenty were on scholarship related to their participation in the baseball program. Of those receiving aid, 3 white student left the program, and 13 white students, 3 Hispanic students, and 1 African American student graduated.

Basketball

There were a total of 13 first-time, full-time students participating in basketball. Of these students, 5 were white, 6 were African-American, and 1 was Taiwanese and 1 was Native American. Thirteen were on scholarship related to their participation in the basketball program. Of the 13 receiving aid, 3 were white, 8 were African-American, 1 was Taiwanese and 1 was Native American. Of the 13 receiving aid, 1 white student, 1 Taiwanese, 1 African-American students transferred, 1 white and 1 African-American student left the program, and 5 African-American, 2 white students and 1 Native American Student graduated.

FEMALE SPORTS

Basketball

There were a total of 10 first-time, full-time students participating in basketball. Of these students, 9 were white, and 1 was Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander. Nine were on scholarship related to their participation in the basketball program. Of the 9 receiving aid, 2 white student transferred, 1 white student left school. Five white students and 1 Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander graduated.

All Other Sports

There were a total of 23 first-time, full-time students participating in volleyball and softball. Of the 23 students, 19 were white, 2 were Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, 1 was Latina, and 1 was American Indian/Alaska Native. Twenty-one of the students were on scholarship related to their participation in volleyball and softball. Of the 21 receiving aid, 17 were white, 2 were Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander, 1 was Latina, and 1 was American Indian/Alaska Native. Of the 21 receiving aid, 1 Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander student transferred, 3 white students left the program, 2 white students did not graduate. Twelve white students, 1 Latina, 1 Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islanders, and 1 American Indian/Alaska Native graduated.
