TOTAL COHORT

Beginning the Fall Semester of the Academic Year 2014, 1,906 first-time, full-time students attended Salt Lake Community College, of which 937 were male and 969 were female students. These 1,906 students identified themselves as the following race/ethnicity:

- White: 588 males and 567 females
- Hispanic: 182 males and 195 females
- Black/African American: 36 males and 29 females
- Asian: 33 males and 58 females
- Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander: 18 males and 27 females
- American Indian/Alaskan Native: 8 males and 21 females
- Nonresident Alien: 28 males and 12 females
- Two or more races: 34 males and 49 females
- Race/Ethnicity Unknown: 10 males and 11 females

ATHLETIC COHORTS

MALE SPORTS

Baseball

There were a total of 16 first-time, full-time students participating in baseball. Of these students, 13 were white, 1 Pacific Islander and 2 were African American. 12 were on scholarship related to their participation in the baseball program. Of those receiving aid, 3 white students left the program, and 1 did not finish. 2 African American students and 6 white students Graduated.

Basketball

There were a total of 8 first-time, full-time students participating in basketball. Of these students, 3 were white, 4 were African-American, 1 was a Pacific Islander. Seven were on scholarship related to their participation in the basketball program. Of the 7 receiving aid, 3 were white, 4 were African-American. Of the 7 receiving aid, 2 African-American student transferred, 2 African-American students graduated, 2 white students graduated and 1 white student transferred.

FEMALE

Basketball

There were a total of 6 first-time, full-time students participating in basketball. Of these students, 3 were white, 1 was African American, one was a Pacific Islander and 1 was a Native American. 6 were on scholarship related to their participation in the basketball program. Of the 6 receiving aid, 1 white student transferred, 1 African American student transferred. 1 white student, 1 African American student, 1 Pacific Islander and 1 Native American student graduated.

All Other Sports

There were a total of 15 first-time, full-time students participating in volleyball and softball. Of the 15 students, 12 were white, 2 were Latina, and 1 was Native-American. 14 of the students were on scholarship related to their participation in volleyball and softball. Of the 14 receiving aid, 11 were white, 2 were Latina, and 1 was Native-American. Of the 14 receiving aid, 1 Native-American student graduated, 1 Latina graduated and 1 Latina did not complete. 3 white students transferred, 1 white student went on a church related mission, and 7 white students graduated.
