2020-2021 ANNUAL ASSESSMENT SUMMARY OF RESULTS

Project (Assessment) Title: Child Care & Family Services Using Vouchers and CCAMPIS to Support Students: Looking at the impact and comparing services.

College-wide Strategic Goals:

- 1. Increase Student Completion.
- 4. Achieve equity in student participation and completion

Assessment Overview:

For this assessment we used our CCAMPIS survey and a Voucher survey to assess the impact of the CCAMPIS funding and the Voucher funding on students to afford childcare, access their classes, complete schoolwork, and re-enroll or graduate. We administered the surveys Summer 2020, Fall 2020, and Spring 2021. Less than 10% of students answered the Spring 2021 survey. We will not post these results as the response rate was so low. We disaggregated the data based on race and ethnicity for Summer 2020 and Fall 2020.

Methodology (Plan/Method):

Target Audience: Students who receive funding through CCAMPIS or the Voucher program.

In collaboration with Data Science & Analytics surveys we administered this survey to ask parents about the impact of childcare services on their ability to participate and succeed as students.

Timeline:

The surveys were distributed at the end of each semester. We followed this timeline:

October: Met with Data Science & Analytics to develop survey and refine questions.

December-May: Administered surveys

May-June: Analyzed results and disaggregated data by race/ethnicity

June: Wrote final assessment

Important Notes: The demographics of students using grant and voucher funds were collected. The survey was administered and analyzed to determine any difference in student experience based on race and ethnicity. When

examining these data, we can see that in some instances there was a very limited number of people representing an entire race, thus if one person chose not to answer the data may not have been representative of the total programming.

In Spring 2021, the rate at which we received answers was extremely low. We will follow up with these recipients to meet requirements of the Department of Education for the CCAMPIS funding.

Action Plan (Use of Results/Improvements/Call to Action)

When comparing the results for Voucher recipients to CCAMPIS recipients the only major difference that was noted was the cost of burden for Voucher recipients in Summer 2020 compared to CCAMPIS recipients during that time. It is obvious that students who are struggling have a difficult time making ends meet and the more cost-effective services we can offer reduce the barriers for students. Henceforth we and the development office have been working hard to find students money. We have Perkins dollars for CTE students, private dollars for Jordan students, and I have asked the development office to help secure funds for students at Eccles who only receive student fee vouchers. We will also help those students by ensuring that they have information about our other services like the food pantry, or the Center for Health and Counseling, or that the College has a basic needs coordinator.

Another difference was the number of time children were enrolled in care. CCAMPIS recipients enroll their children for longer in childcare services taking advantage of our full time slots. This provides them with more time to study or attend classes. With additional funding voucher—only students can use our services for extended periods of time which in turn helps them find time to do their schoolwork. Hopefully we will be able to distribute more money to students who are not eligible for CCAMPIS funding when the development office secures it.

It is also noted that high numbers of students are not taking advantage of enrolling in later classes or obtaining tutoring even though they have affordable childcare services. This could really help with class completion and graduation. This could be because there are limited opportunities for in_person evening classes or tutoring? In the future we will work to improve this by giving parents information about tutoring services, and reminder emails that there are evening classes to enroll in.

Lastly, because CCAMPIS students are required to answer our surveys multiple times during the year they may be experiencing survey burn out. Next year I will survey only the voucher recipients for the purpose of this survey and compare the answers to this year's results. Hopefully we will improve with regards to the actions we are taking.

In conclusion, based on the information we have received we will do the following:

- 1. By July 30, 2021, we will redistribute the surveys this semester. If there are any notable differences, we will then examine what needs to be done.
- 2. By July 30, 2021, we will follow up with the Development Office of SLCC to see if private funds can/have been secured for students who are not attending South City or Jordan Campus Child Cares.
- 3. We will send out a reminder at the end of the term reminding parents that they can use their time at child care to enroll in an evening class or obtain tutoring.
- 4. Next year we will only survey the voucher recipients for this assessment.
