2020-2021 ANNUAL ASSESSMENT SUMMARY OF RESULTS

Project (Assessment) Title:

Identify student veterans who have dropped-out or transferred out from FALL 2017 semester through SUMMER 2020 semester with 25 credits or less to graduate.

Once identified, create a personalized 'Path-To-Completion' program for each student veteran communicating how many credits needed to graduate and remaining GI Bill educational benefits. We are positive that many student veterans don't know they were 'that-close' to being completed.

College-wide Strategic Goal:

#1: Increase Student Completion#4: Achieve Equality in Student Participation and Completion

Assessment Overview:

Can veteran students who have dropped-out between Fall 2017 through Summer 2020, who have completed 51% to 99% (Approximately 25 or less remaining credits) of required credits graduate with interventions from Veterans Services?

The purpose of this assessment is to identify and reach out to each student veteran who have dropped-out before achieving a Certificate or Associate Degree by offering individual-specific support to aid in completion. Students who drop-out possibly do not know how close they are to completion, or how many months of GI Bill educational benefits they have remaining.

Methodology (Plan/Method):

Target population: Veteran students who have dropped-out between fall 2017 and summer 2020 who have completed 51% to 99% (25 credits or less) required credits to graduate.

Once students have been identified, a 'personalized-program' will be developed and presented to each student veteran.

Personalized program will include:

- Remaining credits (percentage) to graduate.
- Available and remaining GI Bill education benefits.
- Personalized Degree Audit with a detailed semester-to-semester pathway to graduation.
- Support from Veterans Services staff recommending SLCC educational services, VA (Veterans Affairs) health care referrals, on Campus VA Counselor to identify and mitigate barriers that hinder completion.
- Veterans Services will partner with the Utah Department of Veterans and Military Affairs to determine remaining GI Bill education benefits that are currently available to each student
- The student will be contacted presenting the individual tailored student veteran pathway to graduation.

Timeline:

September 2020:

- Data Science & Analytics Report Request
 - Fall 2017 through Fall 2020
 - $\circ~~$ 25 Credit Hours or Less Remaining to Graduate

June 2020

- Start Degree Plan for each student identified on the IR report.
- Begin contact of each dropped-out student and present them with their tailored program.

Challenges/Needs

- CHALLENGE: Finding barriers that cannot be mitigated or overcome through the work of the Veterans Services staff or through VA healthcare referrals.
- NEED: Institutional research: Program designed to identify VET (Veteran) and DEP (Dependent) students who have dropped out and not returned while trying to complete a certificate or an associate degree.
- CHALLENGE: Communicating with the target population and receiving return communication.

Results/Finding (Disaggregated by ethnicity/gender)


A request to Data Science & Analytics (DSA) a report detailing semester drop-out and transfer-out data was received. This report compares student veterans from SLCC dropping out or transferring to another higher educational institution before completing their certificate or associate degree. The data obtained begins with the Summer semester of 2017 and ends with Fall semester of 2020. The requested report indicates 630 student veterans dropped-out or transferred to another institution.

The data outlined in this report is to assess and review factual data and review the different areas that can assist in student completion.

Total Number of Students Dropped-Out and Transferred-Out Completion Percentage Total Before Graduation




overwhelming and devastating. Our speculation for dropouts before we received the report was between 75 to 125.






GENDER: Male and Female

The combined data above gives an overview of students who transferred to another higher educational institution before graduating.

Of the 630 enrolled students, 37% transferred to another institution with a 91% completion rate in a 12-semester timeframe before graduating.



Drops Per Semester For Both Male and Female


(12 Semesters)

Action Plan (Use of Results/Improvements/Call to Action)

Since learning of the 630 dropped out and transfer-out students, this is number is more than expected. The assessment will assist those students who dropped out with 85% to 99% completion rate. We have started the process with the VA in obtaining remaining GI Bill benefit for each student. Organizing the gathering of non-completed courses for each student from academic advisor(s) is currently in progress.

The below information box offers completion percentages between 85% and 99% before graduation of all students that a personalized path to completion 'information-packet' will be presented to them. This outreach is two-fold: 1) Increase Enrollment; 2) Letting those students that have dropped out know that as employees at SLCC we care about them. We care enough to assemble this personalized path to completion information packets to assist in their goal of graduation.
