1 DISCOVER

IS CE A GOOD FIT?

Think about what interests you and your plans for your future. With options like art, languages, science and automotive, there may be a Concurrent Enrollment (CE) option for you at your high school. Talk with a counselor to see what options are available at your high school.

2 PLAN

CHOOSE THE BEST CLASSES

It is best to strategically plan which CE classes will benefit you most based on your career goals and interests. Ask your high school counselor about concurrent enrollment student information sessions available at your high school.

3 ADMIT

BECOME A SLCC STUDENT

Complete your admissions application by visiting the CE website listed on this page, click on the "Admissions, Only Once" button and follow the instructions. You only need to do this step once for all your CE classes.

4 REGISTER

SIGN UP FOR CLASSES

Visit the CE website listed on this page, click on "Registration, Each Semester" and follow the instructions. You will need to register yourself for each CE class you take.

5 SAVE MONEY

PAY \$5 PER CREDIT VS. \$190 PER CREDIT

After you register, pay your tuition by visiting the CE website listed on this page, click on "Pay Tuition, Each Semester" and follow the instructions.

	ADVANCED PLACEMENT	CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT
WHAT IS THE PASS RATE?	60% Earn a high enough score to get college credit	80% Earn a grade of C or better. 95% earn a D- or better.
HOW LONG ARE CLASSES?	YEARLONG - 1 course per year	SEMESTER LONG 2 courses per year
HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?	\$93 Per AP Exam	\$5 Per credit. About \$15 per class plus a one-time \$40 admissions fee.
DOES IT TRANSFER?	Varies by college across the country. Gives you credit without a grade.	Transfers to any public Utah college. Outside of Utah it varies by college, grade goes with the class.

MYTHS & FACTS

MYTH #1: Concurrent enrollment is for saving time and money, period.

FACT: If you select classes with a purpose you can absolutely save time and money through concurrent, but studies also show that CE increases your likelihood to complete a college degree.

MYTH #2: I'm not smart enough for college/concurrent enrollment.

FACT: There are concurrent classes for everyone regardless of your skills and interests. Talk to your high school counselor to explore your options.

MYTH #3: My concurrent classes won't transfer to the college I want to go to.

FACT: Concurrent enrollment transfers to colleges and universities across the country. Just like AP it will vary from school to school. Check with the college you want to go to to find out if it transfers.
