## **The Essay Questions**

The essay questions on the SLCC General Scholarship Application are the most important part of the application. It is how applicants let the scholarship committee know who they are! Because of this, it is important that applicants spend time on their essays and do their best work. Scholarship funds are limited, so the application process is highly competitive. The better an applicant does on their essay questions, the better chance they may have of receiving a scholarship.

To help applicants prepare for filling out these questions, here they are:

- 1.) What prompted you to pursue an education at Salt Lake Community College?
- 2.) What are your educational goals?
- 3.) Talk about a personal accomplishment that is unrelated to academics but that means a lot to you.
- 4.) Describe a challenge you have overcome and what you learned from that challenge.
- 5.) What impact would receiving a scholarship have on your ability to complete your education?



## To be eligible for Promise students must:

- Be a Utah resident.
- Receive a Federal Pell Grant.
- Take 9 or more credits during the Fall and Spring semesters, or take 6 or more credits during Summer semester.
- All SLCC students are encouraged to make an appointment with an academic advisor to create a
  degree plan and file the plan in SLCC's online DegreeWorks.
- Maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA and complete 70 percent of attempted courses.
