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**I. PURPOSE**

To describe Salt Lake Community College's policy regarding parking of motor vehicles on campus.

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**II. POLICY**

Parking Services shall operate, maintain and administer a campus motor vehicle parking system as authorized by Utah Code Annotated, Title 53B, Chapter 3, § 103

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**I. PROCEDURES**

A. Motor Vehicle Parking on Campus

vehicle is defined under Utah Code §41-1a-102(65).

Anyone parking a vehicle on campus must comply with the following regulations:

1. Register the vehicle with Parking Services and pay the annual, semester or daily parking fee for the right to park in designated areas, or
2. Park the vehicle in a metered area or pay lot and pay the appropriate fee.

B. Parking Areas

Parking is permitted only in designated areas and only in accordance with all posted signs. Cars must be parked properly within marked stalls.

C. Restrictions

Parking is prohibited 24 hours daily at red curbs, “no parking” areas, bus zones, crosswalks, driveways, sidewalks, on the wrong side of the street, in front of fire hydrants and dumpsters, and other prohibited or reserved parking areas as designated.

Parking is also prohibited in and on unmarked roadways and other unmarked areas. Parking tickets will be issued for noncompliance.

D. Utah Clean Air Act

In compliance with Utah Code §41-6-163.6 (5)(a) all vehicles parked at colleges and universities along the Wasatch Front (from Ogden to Provo) are required to have a current emissions certificate.

E. Vehicle Operator Responsibilities

Parking area designations are subject to change, and it is the motorist's responsibility to be cognizant of such changes. The responsibility for finding an authorized parking space rests with the motor vehicle operator. Lack of a parking space in any desired area is not a valid excuse for failure to comply with these regulations.

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- F. Parking for Drivers with Disabilities  
Stalls for drivers with disabilities are reserved for qualified students, faculty and staff. Vehicles parked in these stalls must display a valid permit issued by Parking and Transportation Services for the use of drivers with disabilities. Special stalls in visitor areas have been identified for the use of visitors to the College with disabilities. Vehicles parked in these stalls must display appropriate license plates or a state-issued parking permit designating an individual with a disability.
- G. Fleet Vehicle Parking  
College owned vehicles are to be parked in maintenance stalls when available or other stalls when necessary and shall not violate "No Parking," "Tow Away," or "Disabled" zones. Drivers of improperly parked College vehicles will be responsible for tickets received. In emergency situations where maintenance vehicles must park in spaces other than those listed above, marker cones must be displayed in the front and rear of the vehicle; or emergency flashers must be activated.
- H. Motorcycle Parking  
Motorcycles, motorbikes, scooters and mopeds must be parked in areas designated for such vehicles and display an appropriate parking permit.
- I. College Responsibility For Vehicle Damage  
The College is not responsible for the care and protection of or damage to any vehicle or its contents when operated or parked on College property. Acceptance of a permit shall constitute an acknowledgement and acceptance of this condition as the privilege to use the College's parking facilities.
- J. Special Parking  
Parking Services reserves the right to change the designated use of lots or roadways at any time to provide for special parking needs. During athletic or special events, Parking Services reserves the right to charge for the use of College parking lots. Vehicles with a current College permit will not be charged except for off-campus sponsored special events. On Saturdays, Sundays and College recognized holidays, campus parking lots are available for parking without a permit except in reserved, handicapped and other specifically designated lots or spaces.
