- Recognized nationally as a leader in Artificial Intelligence Teaching and Learning, having implemented the first Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning associate's degree program in the nation in partnership with Intel in 2021, and hosted the first national AI Teaching & Learning Summit in 2023;
- Recognized by the U.S. Department of Education as the 9th highest transfer partnership in the nation, 1st in Arizona, including a 45% increase in transfer for Native American students, 39% for Black students, and 13% for Latinx;

- and was successfully awarded a Title V grant in 2022;
- Successfully launched a Promise Program with the Town of Queen Creek and workforce scholarship programs with the Town of Gilbert and the City of Chandler;
- Developed regional, multi-college career pathways in information technology, aerospace technology, and advanced manufacturing, including a quick-start semiconductor technician program visited by the First Lady
