

Hazard Communication. Employees have “right to know” what hazards they are exposed to at work. Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) are required for all potentially hazardous materials used at the college.

Fire Extinguisher Training. OSHA requires annual fire extinguisher training of ALL employees. Contact your building marshal schedule training. The training can be done in 30 minutes as part of a staff meeting. Hands on (live fire) practice is offered 1-2 times per year. Watch MyPage for the scheduled times.

Universal Precaution. “Universal Precaution” means that we treat all medical waste as if the person the waste was generated from was infected. Universal Precaution a/k/a Blood Borne Pathogen.

Lock Out Precaution. The college is required to have a written policy on the proper isolation of electrical equipment during repair.

Crane. All overhead cranes must be inspected and certified annually by a third party.

Hearing Conservation. If employees work in a high noise area, they need to be part of our hearing conservation program. We can evaluate the workplace and decide if an employee needs hearing protection. The college has the responsibility to provide employees with proper personal protective equipment.

Respiratory Protection. Employees who are exposed to possible air contaminants need to be part of this written program.

Forklift. Any employee who operates a fork lift or other lifting device must be licensed by the College. We provide training and hands-on testing for this certification.

Confined Space. The college has identified and has a written program for employees entering a confined space.
