General Rules*:

- The film must be directed by a SLCC student.
Must be between 1-20 minutes in length, including credits. Anything over 20 min. will be disqualified.
It must fall within the MPAA PG-13 rating guidelines and the SLCC exceptions.

Film Festival Requirements

- Must be produced and directed by current SLCC student(s) (ID will be checked)
- The film will not be longer than 1-20 min. (Credits included). We are very strict on this policy. There will be no chance to reedit the film once its submitted. Anything over 20 minutes will be disqualified automatically.
- The film must fall within a PG-13 rating with the following exceptions:
 - The “F” word cannot be used in any sense or form of the word
 - No Nudity
- **We will no longer accept any films that have been previously submitted to the festival.**
- The films must contain original music or must have written permission from the artist, group, or record company for any copyrighted material. You must present consent when entering the film. If there is any copyrighted material in the film without permission the film will be disqualified.
- All films must be turned in by Friday, Oct. 23rd before 4:30 PM in DVD format. The DVD must be in a case labeled with the director’s name, title of the film, and contact information. The title of the film should also be on the DVD.
- If you submit more than one film they need be on separate DVD’s and forms
- One entry per category. Limit of three films total. Please categorize your film correctly; it will increase your chances of winning.
- Films will be screened prior to the festival by a selected panel.
 - If there is a surplus of films, the screening panel will select the films to be shown during the two days.
 - If the ‘F’ word is used in any form, or if the film exceeds the time limit it will automatically be disqualified. There will be no chance to edit.
 - If the film is disqualified for any other reason the director will be notified and have 3 days to fix and resubmit the edited copy.

Student Life and Leadership reserves the rights to disqualify any films for any reason, including those that violate the guidelines that have been set.

MPAA PG 13 Rating

A PG-13 motion picture may go beyond the PG rating in theme, violence, nudity, sensuality, language, adult activities or other elements, but does not reach the restricted R category. The theme of the motion picture by itself will not result in a rating greater than PG-13, although depictions of activities related to a mature theme may result in a restricted rating for the motion picture. Any drug use will initially require at least a PG-13 rating. More than brief nudity will require at least a PG-13 rating, but such nudity in a PG-13 rated motion picture generally will not be sexually oriented. There may be depictions of violence in a PG-13 movie, but generally not both realistic and extreme or persistent violence. A motion picture’s single use of one of the harsher sexually-derived words, though only as an expletive, initially requires at least a PG-13 rating. More than one such expletive requires an R rating, as must even one of those words used in a sexual context. The Rating Board nevertheless may rate such a motion picture PG-13 if, based on a special vote by a two-thirds majority, the Raters feel that most American parents would believe that a PG-13 rating is appropriate because of the context or manner in which the words are used or because the use of those words in the motion picture is inconspicuous.
