Historical Sketch of Salt Lake Community College 1948-

Salt Lake Community College began teaching classes September 14, 1948 as the Salt Lake Area Vocational School. A product of the GI Bill, the school evolved out of the War Production Training School established at West High School during World War II. After most federal support dried up in 1946, the Salt Lake City School District continued funding the program on its own, which was a burden for the district. The district, along with the State Board of Vocational Education, the Salt Lake Chamber of Commerce, the local American Legion, and Veterans of Foreign Wars successfully lobbied the state legislature to create state-supported vocational schools. On 19 March 1947, money was appropriated for establishing vocational schools in all school districts serving populations of at least 140,000.

The Salt Lake City School Board selected long-time vocational teacher Howard Gundersen as the school's first president. The old Troy Laundry Building on 461 South 600 East in Salt Lake City was selected as the school's first building, and equipment was donated from Salt Lake area high schools which had housed War Production Training Schools. Gundersen received authorization from the Salt Lake City, Park City, and Tooele School districts to teach 39 vocational programs, although teachers could not be found for all of them immediately.

Newspaper ads for the school carried the slogan, "Learn to Earn," which would be used into the 1970s. In its first quarter, tuition for the school was \$78 annually, and 246 students registered in 14 classes. By the following quarter, 948 students were enrolled, including 589 veterans.

In 1949, J. Bracken Lee became governor of Utah. A fiscal conservative, he opposed the Area Vocational School, believing it duplicated services available elsewhere. When the legislature presented the 1949–1950 budget with expenses projected to exceed revenues by \$2 million, Lee used line-item vetoes to cut the entire \$500,000 appropriated to the school. Lee's veto drew criticism from The Salt Lake Tribune, labor unions, and veterans' organizations, but the supporters of the cut stood firm, alleging wastefulness at the school. Only by scaling back operations to \$145,000 annually was Gundersen able to keep the school open.

The second President of the school, Jay L. Nelson (1949–1978), referred to the first years of Lee's governorship as "the starvation years". No state funding was provided to the school again until 1951 when it began receiving modest subsidies, and a \$312,000 grant to purchase the Troy Laundry Building.

Initially the school was seen as a central location for high school vocational education, and the school was thus an extension of public secondary education. The school was guided jointly under the direction of the state and local school board until 1959 when it changed its name to Salt Lake Trade Technical Institute, reflecting the more adult-oriented nature of the school. Governance for the school also moved solely into the state's hands under the State Board for Vocational Education.

In 1967 most departments of the school (now renamed Utah Technical College at Salt Lake) moved to the current location at 4600 South Redwood Road in what is now Taylorsville. The state legislature

granted money for expansion at the Taylorsville Redwood campus, which is now the primary campus of SLCC. A thriving vocational program existed at the original site well in to the 1980s that served thousands of students seeking basic education and occupational skills.

In 1969 the State unified the scattered public higher education direction into the State Board of Higher Education (later called the Board of Regents). However, the Technical College was not placed entirely under this board. Instead, it was jointly governed by the State Board of Higher Education and the State Board of Vocational Education. Turf wars between the boards erupted almost immediately in 1970 and again in 1974 when the boards fought over who had authority to raise salaries (it was decided that the vocational board controlled wages, but that the higher education board dictated budgets). The Board of Higher Education first sought to convert the schools into community colleges in 1970, which the vocational board outright rejected. The Vocational Board eventually relinquished control of the school in 1978 with an agreement that technical school maintain 75% vocational training, which was state law at the time. President Jay L. Nelson believed this was necessary to prevent the school from becoming merely a feeder for the University of Utah. However, in 1987 the school formally became Salt Lake Community College and the old requirement 75% for vocational training ended.

Scope and Content of the Publications Fonds

Salt Lake Community College (previously known as Salt Lake Area Vocational School [SLAV] 1948-1959, Salt Lake Trade Technical Institute [SLTTI] 1959-1967, and Utah Technical College [UTC] 1967-1987) is a Community College with roots in vocational education. SLCC's offerings have expanded over the years to include programs, degrees, certificates, and diplomas in other disciplines. This collection includes textual materials created by the College, individuals associated with the College, and related entities between 1948 and the present. The Publications Fonds is divided into eleven series.

Series 1:

Calendar, College Master, are records created by the College that document the academic year. Included in this series are 1.00 linear feet of calendars.

Series 2:

Catalog, College General and Program Specific, are records created primarily by the Offices of Curriculum and Scheduling that document and describe course offerings. Included in this series are 7.92 linear feet of catalogs.

Series 3:

Class Schedule, College and Program Specific, are records created primarily by the Office of Scheduling at the College that document the times and locations of course offerings. Included in this series are 7.5 linear feet of class schedules and correspondence.

Series 4:

Directories and Rosters, College, are records created by the College that list faculty and staff and document related information. Included in this series are 1.25 linear feet of textual records, including registers, rosters, and newspaper clippings.

Series 5:

Fact Books, College, are records created by various Offices of the College that provide annual data about the College. Starting in 1983, the College began publishing statistical reports, staff and faculty demographics, and student demographics in the form of fact books. These records provide a statistical perspective on the state of the College across a given academic year. Fact books were published in print from 1983 until 2015 and digitally from 2012 to the present. Included in this series are 3.44 linear feet of textual records, including statistical reports, staff and faculty demographics, and student demographics.

Series 6:

Faculty or Staff Authored Publications are works created by College-affiliated individuals. Works in this series are a wide variety of genres, formats, and styles, such as fiction, poetry, and textbooks. Included in this series are 5 linear feet of textual records, including manuscripts and published works.

Series 7:

Literary Publications, College Sponsored, are works created by students at the College. These are primarily literary works, including short fiction and poetry, as well as short nonfiction, such as essays. Included in this series are 2.81 linear feet of literary arts publications, including booklets and magazines.

Series 8:

Newsletters & Newspapers, College, are records created by administrative units at the College, as well as students. The series is divided into three subseries:

- Subseries A: Faculty and Staff Newsletters houses newsletters and bulletins which were published by College personnel. These are both College-wide and group-specific, and geared toward an audience of College professionals.
- Subseries B: Student Newsletters and Magazines houses newsletters, bulletins, and magazines published by various student groups on campus. The intended readership is student groups on campus and the materials document the activities of particular groups.
- Subseries C: Student Newspapers houses editions of the student newspaper. This newspaper is campus-wide and covers both campus and current events. The student newspaper has changed its name several times: The Tradesman (1955-59); Tech Topics (1962-73); Points West (1973-87); No Name Brand Newspaper (1987); Horizon (1987-2001); and The Globe (2001-present). The newspaper was published in print until January 2020, and has been published digitally since then.

Included in this series are 14.38 linear feet of newspapers, newsletters, and news bulletins.

Series 9:

Yearbooks are books created by students, in collaboration with staff and faculty at the College, which document student life over the course of the school year. Yearbooks were published between 1966 and 1971, under two names: *Tradewinds* (1966-69) and *Tecknika* (1970-71). Included in this series are 1.25 linear feet of student yearbooks.

Series 10:

Handbooks & Orientations are records created by the College that provide information on student life, orientation, services, and College practices. The series is divided into two subseries:

- Subseries A: Faculty and Staff Handbooks and Guides houses handbooks, guides, and orientation materials designed for members of College faculty and staff.
- Subseries B: Student Handbooks and Guides houses handbooks, guides, and orientation materials designed for students. Included here are orientation folders, the student code of conduct, and student handbooks.

Included in this series are 1.15 linear feet of textual records, including handbooks and brochures.

Series 11:

Promotional Materials are materials created and published by the College in order to promote the College's offerings. Many of these materials were designed to be distributed either through the mail or at College events. Included in this series is 3.44 linear feet of textual records, such as mailers, magazines, and brochures.
