What to Bring

When You Complete the 2022-2023 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

Independent/Married Student:

- Personal email account information and password.
- Social Security/Resident Card (not ITIN).
- 2020 taxes and W2s. If student did not file taxes but worked, bring W2s. If married, bring both student and spouse information.
- Marriage/divorce/separation date, both month and year.
- Asset information including but not limited to, amount in savings, checking and investments.
- o If the married, spouse's information is required.

Dependent Student:

- Personal email account information and password. This email must be different than the parent's email.
- Social Security/Resident Card (not ITIN).
- o 2020 taxes and W2s. If student did not file taxes but worked, bring W2s.
- o Driver's license.
- Asset information including but not limited to, amount in savings, checking and investments.

Parent:

- Personal email account information and password.
- Social Security/Resident Card (not ITIN).
- 2020 taxes and W2s. If parent(s) did not file taxes but worked, bring W2s. If married, bring both parents'/step-parents' information.
- o Parents' birthdates.
- Marriage/divorce/separation date, both month and year.
- Asset information including but not limited to, amount in savings, checking and investments.
- If the parent is remarried, stepparent's information is required.
