



# **Frequently Asked Questions**

# Midterm 1 Retake Workshops & Exam Retake

#### Q1 Who is required to go to the Midterm 1 Retake Workshops?

A: Students who score **below 73**% on Midterm 1 Exam or missed their Midterm 1 Exam are required to attend a "**Retake**" **Workshop**" before the "**Exam Retake**". Students who score **between 73-89**% on Midterm 1 Exam are highly encouraged to attend a workshop before their optional "**Exam Retake**".

#### Q2 What will the students need to attend the workshops?

A: The students will be instructed about the requirement through the "<u>Midterm 1 Exam Cover Sheet</u>" attached to their original Midterm 1 exams. Students who missed the original exam will need to request an instructed "<u>Midterm 1 Exam</u> Cover Sheet" from their instructors.

#### Q3 What happens in a workshop?

A: Students should bring their graded exams and are encouraged to come with specific questions. The students will go over their mistakes on the midterm, either one-on-one with the workshop leader, a tutor, or in a small group. They will work on problems that will help them understand the concepts they missed.

#### Q4 What happens after the students take the workshop?

A: They will be cleared by the workshop leader for "<u>Exam Retake</u>" by signature on the <u>"Midterm 1 Exam Cover Sheet"</u>. For students who participate in the online workshops, they will be cleared by online workshop leaders through directly working with the Math Department and Testing Centers.

#### Q5 Where and when do the students retake the exams?

A: The students can only retake the exam in person at any of the Testing Center during the dates and hours listed on the <u>"Midterm 1 Exam Cover Sheet".</u> Only <u>none-graphing calculator</u> is permitted, and the maximum of <u>1 hour</u> testing time is allowed.

#### Q6 Do students need to make an appointment at the Testing Center?

A: No, they do not need an appointment. Students may walk in with their completed "Midterm 1 Exam Cover Sheet" during the hours listed (with enough time to complete the exam).

#### Q7 How is the Midterm 1 Exam Retake graded?

A: In order for the midterm retakes to be fair for students who scored 90% and above on the initial exam, the highest attainable score on the retake is 90%. If a student missed the original exam due to an accident or illness, the 100% scale can be used. The student must provide sufficient proof to the Math Department. The final Midterm 1 grade will be the better score between the original grade and the "Exam Retake" grade.

### Q8 Which students can attend the online workshops?

## Q9 Who is responsible for grading the Midterm 1 Exam Retake?

A: The student's instructor is responsible.

#### Q10 Who is responsible for getting the exams to the instructor?

A: The Math Department will work with the Testing Centers to obtain the exams and send to the instructors for grading.

## Q11 Will this process be replicated for other exams?

A: No, the **Retake** opportunity is only offered for the Midterm 1 Exam. There are review workshops offered weekly for all Math 0980 students throughout the entire semester, with extra ones added before the Midterm 2 exam and the Final Exam. ## Q12 What to do if the retake score is still below 73%?

### Q13 What if a student cannot attend a workshop?

A: If a student cannot attend any workshop(s), then he/she must bring a copy of the following documentation to the Math Department, such as a work schedule, a time card, a letter from a supervisor, or a doctor's note. The documentation needs to indicate that the student is not able to attend any of the workshops offered. Student can also send any of the documents to <a href="mailto:math@slcc.edu">math@slcc.edu</a> with the student's name, S# and contact information.

Q14 Can online students who cannot take the retake on the Taylorsville Campus use their normal proctor for the retake? A: Yes, they would use their normal proctor and must coordinate the exam through the Testing Center.
