Admissions Criteria for Spring 2027



Applicants are selected annually on a merit-based/competitive admission process. Application does not guarantee admission. See the [Health Sciences Admissions website](#) for current application information as all admissions criteria are subject to change for future application periods.

SLCC ADMISSION PROCESS

1. [Apply to SLCC](#) as a degree-seeking student and declare Health Sciences as your Area of Study, and Mortuary Science as the Program of Study. Due to the selective admission process, you will be declared as a Pre-Health Sciences-AS student with a concentration in Mortuary Science (MORT) as you work through the pre-admission's requirements.
2. For transfer credit, complete all the required steps in the [SLCC Transfer Evaluation process](#). Be sure to submit transcripts for ALL colleges and universities where prerequisite coursework and prior degrees have been completed. *This process may take 4-6 weeks or longer and must be completed before a student's application is considered so plan accordingly.*
3. Complete [SLCC Placement Process](#) or submit current SAT/ACT test scores if MATH and ENGL coursework have not been transferred to SLCC.
4. Schedule an appointment with your [Mortuary Science Academic Advisor online](#) or call 801-957-6215. Students are encouraged to meet regularly with the Mortuary Science advisor.
5. ALL communications will be through BruinMail.

MORTUARY SCIENCE APPLICATION PROCESS

Items 1-5 **must** be completed for students to be eligible to apply to the Mortuary Science Program and move on to Items 8 & 9. Items 6 & 7 are optional admissions criteria that may give an applicant additional consideration in the application process. **All support documentation must be uploaded to the application portal at the time of applying.** Applicants will not be able to make changes to their application or upload documents after application is submitted. The Health Sciences Admissions Office will not accept documents via email except for the documentation needed to verify anticipated final grade for prerequisite courses in progress at the time of application.

1. Mandatory Academic Prerequisites

Prerequisite courses are required before starting the program but may be in progress when submitting the application **if the courses are completed with a final grade by or prior to Sept 1st.** If you are in progress with any mandatory prerequisite courses past Sept 1st, you will have to wait until the next application. The prerequisite courses must be completed with a **C grade or better except for Mort 1010 which must be completed with a B or better.**

*Students who have already taken a different ACCT course can request a substitution exception to be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

2. Verification of High School Graduation

Verification of high school graduation or equivalent (GED) will be required. Documentation may include a transcript, diploma, or a letter of explanation of why documentation cannot be provided if applicable.

3. Situational Judgement Test (SJT)

All applicants must complete a proctored, 30-question assessment **prior** to applying for admission. Applicants will schedule a testing time with any [SLCC Testing Center](#) to complete the assessment via Canvas. Applicants are allowed to take the SJT only once per admissions cycle. Any additional attempts to take the SJT will not be allowed and will disqualify an application for consideration. You may listen to this [podcast](#) for more information about the SJT.

4. Job Shadow

It is required to shadow a licensed Funeral Director for at least 4 hours prior to applying to the Mortuary Sciences program. Employment at a funeral home, under a licensed Funeral Director, may be counted. The required [Mortuary Science Job Shadow Verification form](#) must be completed with the Funeral Director who oversaw the shadowing/employment prior to applying.

5. Driver's License

Applicants must have a valid driver's license and be able to drive a standard vehicle.

6. Complete Program Corequisite Courses

The following corequisite courses are required to graduate from the Mortuary Science program and can be taken while in the program. However, students who complete these required courses before applying to the Mortuary Science program will receive additional consideration on their application; to receive additional consideration on the application, these courses must be completed before the application deadline and not in-progress. All courses must be completed with a **C grade or better**.

7. Preferred (But Not Required) Items

- **Employment with Funeral Home:** Employment in any position with a funeral home is encouraged prior to applying to the program. Applicants who submit a signed letter from employer, on employer letterhead that states job title and duration of employment will receive additional consideration on the application. Work experience must be for 3 months or longer but does not have to be current. This is in addition to the required shadowing form.
- **Graduated from an Area Health Education Center (AHEC) program:** Applicants who have graduated from an AHEC program in the last 5 years will receive additional consideration on the Mortuary Science program application.
- **Community Engagement:** Applicants who have demonstrated a willingness to serve others through volunteer community engagement will receive additional consideration on their application. Engagement should have occurred within the last 5 years and since high school graduation without payment or reward. Continual experiences and service engagement with underserved groups or populations are encouraged. Only one experience will be considered for the application. Applicants should provide a letter of recommendation from the mentor that supervised community engagement which includes the type of service, length of time committed to service, and where the service was performed.
- **Prior Degrees:** Additional consideration will be given to students for the highest degree earned prior to applying to the Mortuary Sciences program. Official transcripts showing prior degree must be sent to SLCC through [the Transfer Evaluation process](#) to be considered.
- **Veteran Status:** Additional consideration will be given to students who are Veterans who are verified through the [VA Office](#).

8. Submit Online Health Sciences Application

Log-in to "MySLCC">Click on "View All Cards" (Found on the right-hand side) >Type in and click on "Selective Admissions Forms"> Click on "Start Here" under Health Sciences Programs if you're a first-time applicant. Click on "here" under "apply to open admissions sessions" if you've already registered for the Health Sciences Admissions Portal. Choose Mortuary Science in the application.

The Mortuary Science online application will only appear on the menu during open application periods. There is a non-refundable application fee. Up to **24** students are accepted every Spring Semester. This program requires full-time attendance.

9. Multiple Mini-Interview (MMI) and Mandatory Information Session

After the application and prior to acceptance, qualified candidates will be contacted via the email on the application from the Health Sciences Admissions team with details on how to prepare for and complete a Multiple Mini Interview (MMI) combined with a **mandatory** information session at the Jordan Campus. Students are encouraged to dress professionally and show up a few minutes early to the interview.

Multiple Mini Interviews (MMI's) and Mandatory Information Sessions Late September
Notification of Conditional Acceptance/Alternate/Denial October/November
Orientation Information will be sent via "Full Acceptance" letter to email on application
Mortuary Science Program Begins January

*The School of Health Sciences may reopen the application after the established deadline if it is in the best interest of the program to do so. Check: <http://www.slcc.edu/hs/admissions/> regularly to see if the application has been reopened. All application requirements need to be fulfilled for an application to be considered. Applicants that apply by the original application deadlines will take priority.

AFTER PROGRAM CONDITIONAL ACCEPTANCE

American DataBank Complio: Students will be required to create an American DataBank Complio account after being conditionally accepted into the program to order their background check, submit necessary documentation, and meet immunization compliance requirements; *associated fees applicable to each package.*

If conditionally accepted into the program, students will receive detailed instructions from the Health Sciences Admissions team to complete this process. For specific and updated information, please see the "After You're Accepted Into The Program" section under the desired program on the [Mortuary Science Admissions website](#).

1. **Immunizations:** Order "Immunization Compliance Package" from American DataBank Complio. The SLCC [Center for Health and Counseling](#) offers immunizations at a discounted rate for qualified students.
 - a. Required immunizations for the Mortuary Sciences program:
 - i. Annual Tuberculosis (see HS website)
 - ii. Hepatitis B (Series and titer **may take up to 1 year, so start well in advance**)
2. **Background Check:** Order "Criminal Background Check Package" through American Databank Complio.
 - a. The School of Health Sciences strongly recommends that prospective students take measures to have criminal offenses (felonies and/or misdemeanors) expunged if possible. Students can review [Criminal History Guidelines on DOPL's website](#). Information regarding how to expunge criminal records may be found here: <https://www.utcourts.gov/howto/expunge/>
3. **Drug Screening:** Order "Drug Screening Package" through American DataBank Complio.
 - a. Directions will be provided in the conditional acceptance letter.

Program Hours

Courses in the Mortuary Science program are typically taught two days a week at varying days and times depending on the semester. Courses in the program typically start as early as 6 am or 7 am and end between 3 pm and 5 pm depending on the semester and the section of labs students are placed into. Course times may also depend upon program and clinical site needs and may vary based on program director and faculty discretion.

National Board Exam and Licensing Information

Students must complete both sections of the official National Board Exam to qualify for licensure. In addition to graduating from the Mortuary Science AAS program, students planning to work as funeral directors *in Utah* are required to complete at least 2,000 hours and 50 embalmings under the supervision of a licensed funeral service director over a period of not less than one year as well as obtain a passing score on the above-mentioned examination.
