SPRING 2027 COHORT SELECTIVE ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Prerequisite courses must be completed with a C grade or better (MORT 1010 must be completed with a B grade or better) by the end of Summer semester before submitting an application to the program.

Applicants are encouraged to complete corequisites before applying to the program. Additional consideration will be given to applicants who have taken and meet minimum grade requirements for COMM, MKTG 1960 or HS 2050, and MGT 2050 at the time of application.

IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT TRANSFER CREDIT

- It is the applicant's responsibility to make sure their transfer credit has been fully transferred to SLCC prior to the program's application deadlines.
- If a student has courses they are transferring from another school, their transcripts
 must be evaluated by the SLCC Transfer Evaluation Office and their courses must
 be posted to SLCC DegreeWorks (their MySLCC account), before the program's
 application deadline (priority and final application deadlines apply). IT CAN TAKE
 SEVERAL WEEKS FOR TRANSCRIPTS TO BE EVALUATED.
- Students should declare Health Sciences as their Area of Study and Mortuary Science as the Program of Study when applying to SLCC. If the program of study

does not match the information submitted on the transfer evaluation request, courses applicable to the program may not be transferred to SLCC.

VERIFICATION OF HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION OR EQUIVALENT (GED)

Proof of high school graduation is required to apply. Documentation may include a transcript, diploma, or a letter of explanation if you do not have supporting documentation. **You will be required to upload this information as part of your application.**

ADMISSIONS TESTING

A Situational Judgement Test (SJT) will be required as part of the application process. The SJT is an assessment in which students respond to 30 ethical based scenarios within a one-hour time limit. Applicants must take the SJT during the open application session at any SLCC Testing Center <u>BEFORE</u> submitting their application. A non-refundable \$30 testing fee will be due at the time of registration. Applications received without taking the SJT <u>before</u> submission will not be considered. Applicants will not be notified of their final score after taking the SJT and may only take the test <u>one</u> time during the open application cycle. Any additional attempts to take the SJT will not be allowed and will disqualify an application for consideration. SCHEDULE AN EXAM RESERVATION

- Log in to MySLCC
- Go to the 'Testing Services' tile card.
- If 'Testing Services' tile card is not found on your home page:
 - 1. Find 'Discover' using the icon at the top left or 'Discover More' at the very bottom of your home page.
 - 2. Type 'testing' in the search box.
 - 3. Pin 'Testing Services' to MYSLCC home page.
- Select the 'Testing Services' tile card.
- Select the relevant Testing Center (Redwood, Jordan, South City, or Herriman) to proceed to schedule your reservation for the SJT.
- Once in RegisterBlast:
 Navigate to the drop-down menus in RegisterBlast and select 'Health Science Pre-Admission' and then the Mortuary Science Spring 2027 test. Please make

- an appointment <u>only</u> for the Mortuary Science Spring 2027 assessment as registering for the wrong exam will invalidate your results.
- Once you have added the exam to your cart, ensure that you push the green 'Complete Registration' button to finalize the appointment.
- After your appointment has been scheduled, you will be sent a confirmation link to your bruinmail with information on how to self-enroll in the Canvas course for this exam. You will need to self-enroll before coming to take your SJT.

JOB SHADOW

The Mortuary Science program at SLCC requires students to complete a mandatory Job Shadow of at least four hours with a licensed funeral director to apply to the program. Employment at a funeral home, under the direction of a licensed funeral director, may be counted. The completed form must be uploaded as part of your application.

DRIVER'S LICENSE

Applicants must have a valid driver's license and be able to drive a standard vehicle. Proof of license will be required to be submitted with your application.

PREFERRED BUT NOT REQUIRED

Applicants who submit documentation showing the following experiences may be given extra consideration for the program if they have fulfilled all the program application requirements.

- Funeral Home employment (Must have worked for at least 3 months) Applicants
 must submit a signed letter from the employer (on letterhead) that states their job
 title and the duration of their employment. Work experience does not have to be
 current.
- Graduated from an Area Health Education Centers (AHEC) program within the last five years Must submit certification.
- **Prior associates and/or bachelor's degree** Degree(s) must be posted on official college transcript.
- **Verified Veteran's status** through the Veteran's Service office.
- Community Engagement Applicants who have demonstrated a willingness to serve others through volunteer community engagement will receive additional consideration on their application. Community engagement can take many forms, including volunteering at food banks, homeless shelters, emergency assistance

programs, neighborhood cleanup programs, or service through nonprofit, civic, or religious organizations.

Community Engagement Criteria:

- Engagement should have occurred within the last five years and since high school graduation
- Continual experiences encouraged
- Must be served without payment or reward
- Service engagement with underserved groups or populations is encouraged
- Only one experience will be considered for the application

Submit a letter of recommendation from the mentor who supervised community engagement as part of your application. The letter must discuss the type of service, length of time committed to serving, and where the service was performed.

Any document or information you wish to have considered on your application must be uploaded while completing your application. Additional documentation cannot be considered once you have submitted your application.

MANDATORY MULTIPLE MINI-INTERVIEW (MMI) AND INFORMATION SESSION

Prior to acceptance, qualified candidates will be contacted within 10 days after the application submission period ends to sign up for a *mandatory* Multiple Mini Interview (MMI) and Information Session at the Jordan Campus. MMI's and Information Sessions will be held on Monday, September 21, 2026, from 2:00–7:00 p.m., and Wednesday, September 23, 2026, from 9:00 a.m.–2:00 p.m. Candidates will be required to sign up for a two-hour time slot on one of the days to complete the MMI and Information Session. Interviews are conducted in-person and cannot be completed online or exceptions made for a later time. Please be certain you will be able to attend in-person should you qualify to move forward for the interview process before submitting your application.
