School of Health Sciences Mortuary Science-Associate of Applied Science Admissions Criteria for Spring 2024



Applicants are selected annually on a merit-based/competitive admission process. Application does not guarantee admission. See the <u>Health Sciences Admissions website</u> for current application information. Review <u>this video</u> for an overview of the Mortuary Science Program.

SLCC ADMISSION PROCESS

- 1. Apply to SLCC as a degree-seeking student and declare Health Sciences as your Area of Study, and Mortuary Science as the Program of Study. Due to the selective admission process, you will be declared as a Pre-Medical Health Sciences-AS student with a concentration in Mortuary Science as you work through the pre-admissions requirements.
- 2. Verification of high school graduation or equivalent (GED) will be required before the Mortuary Science admissions deadline. Send official high school transcripts to <a href="https://disable.com/high-school/lines.com/
- 3. For transfer credit, complete all the required steps in the <u>SLCC Transfer Evaluation process</u>. Be sure to submit transcripts for ALL colleges and universities where prerequisite coursework has been completed. *This process may take 4-6 weeks and must be completed before a student's application will be considered*.
- 4. Complete <u>SLCC Placement Process</u> or submit current SAT/ACT test scores if MATH and ENGL coursework have not been transferred to SLCC.
- 5. Schedule an appointment with your <u>Mortuary Science Academic Advisor online</u> or call 801-957-6215. Students are encouraged to meet regularly with the Mortuary Science advisor.
- 6. ALL communication will be through BruinMail.

MORTUARY SCIENCE APPLICATION PROCESS

Items 1-4 **must** be completed for students to be eligible to apply to the Mortuary Science Program. Items 5-7 are optional admissions criteria that may give an applicant extra consideration in the application process.

1. Mandatory Academic Prerequisites

Prerequisite courses are encouraged to be completed prior to applying to the program but <u>may be in progress</u> when applying to the Mortuary Science Program. The following courses must be completed with a **C grade or better**. For **Fall 23 and beyond**, **Mort 1010 must be completed with a B or better**.

2. Verification of High School Graduation

Verification of high school graduation or equivalent (GED) will be required before the Mortuary Science admissions deadline. Send official high school transcripts to HighSchoolTranscripts@slcc.edu.

3. Job Shadow

<u>Documentation of a mandatory job shadow</u> of at least 4 hours with a licensed Funeral Director must be submitted to the <u>Health Sciences Admissions Office</u> prior to the application deadline for the Mortuary Science Program.

4. Submit Online Health Sciences Application

Log in to your "MySLCC" portal >> Click on the blue "Discover More" button at the bottom of the portal >> Search for the "Selective Admissions Forms" tile >> Click on the "Health Science Program Admissions" link. The Mortuary Science online application will only appear on the menu during open application periods. There is a non-refundable application fee of \$25. Up to **24** students are accepted every Spring Semester. This program requires full-time day attendance.

NOTE: After verification of completed prerequisites and application submissions; applicants will be required to attend a Mandatory Information Session.

5. Complete Program Support Courses

Students are highly encouraged to complete the following support courses before starting the Mortuary Science program. All courses must be completed with a **C grade or better** and must be done before graduation from the program.

6. Employment with Funeral Home

Although not required, employment with a funeral home is highly encouraged prior to applying to the program.

Documentation of work experience of <u>3 months or more</u> must be submitted to the <u>Health Sciences Admissions Office</u> within two business days of submitting your application.

Letters received after the application deadline will not be considered.

The document must adhere to the following guidelines:

- ☐ Written on employer letterhead
- ☐ State the job title/position
- ☐ Indicate how long the position was held
- ☐ Be signed by a Funeral Home Director

7. Veteran Status

Additional consideration will be given to students who are Veterans who are verified through the VA Office.

AFTER PROGRAM ACCEPTANCE

1. **American DataBank Complio**: Students are required to create an American DataBank Complio account to order theirbackground check, submit necessary documentation, and meet immunization compliance requirements. Create an account by going to: https://saltlakecc.complio.com/

- 2. Immunizations: Order "Immunization Compliance Package" from American DataBank Complio, \$15.
 - a. If accepted into the program, this subscription will need to be renewed every 12 months while in the program for \$15.
 - b. For specific information, please see the "After You're Accepted Into The Program" section under the desired program on the <u>Health Sciences Admissions website</u>.
 - c. Immunization requirements are subject to change, therefore check the website often and far enough in advance to be able to accommodate deadlines. For questions on immunizations, please contact 801-957-6253 or healthsciencesadmissions@slcc.edu.
 - d. Required immunizations officially documented and uploaded into American DataBank Complio:
 - i. Annual Tuberculosis (see HS website)
 - ii. Hepatitis B (Series and titer may take up to 1 year, so start well in advance)
 - iii. COVID-19
- 3. Background Check: Order "Criminal Background Check Package" through American Databank Complio, \$29
 - a. Students assume the risk if their criminal background check is not clear. If students do not pass the background check, they may not be accepted into the program. This may result in withdrawal from the program after the tuition refund deadline has passed. The clinical site will make the final determination about accepting students for clinical placement.
 - b. It is strongly recommended that prospective students take measures to have criminal offenses <u>expunged</u> or sealed from their record if possible. Students can review <u>Criminal History Guidelines on DOPL's website</u>. Students are advised to contact the <u>Health Sciences Admissions Coordinator</u> with any questions or concerns prior to applying to the program.
- 4. Drug Screening: Order "Drug Screening Package" through American DataBank Complio, \$35
 - a. You will have 48 hours to complete the test once ordered.

Program Hours

Courses in the Mortuary Science program are typically taught two days a week at varying days and times depending on the semester. Courses in the program typically start as early as 6 am or 7 am and end between 3 pm and 5 pm depending on the semester and the section of labs students are placed into. Course times may also depend upon program and clinical site needs and may vary based on program coordinator and faculty discretion.

National Board Exam and Licensing Information

Students must complete both sections of the official National Board Exam to graduate. In addition to graduating from the Mortuary Science AAS program, students planning to work as funeral directors *in Utah* are required to complete at least 2,000 hours and 50 embalmings under the supervision of a licensed funeral service director over a period of not less than one year as well as obtain a passing score on the above-mentioned examination.
