# School of Health Sciences Mortuary Science-Associate of Applied Science Admissions Criteria for Spring 2025



Applicants are selected annually on a merit-based/competitive admission process. Application does not guarantee admission. See the <u>Health Sciences Admissions website</u> for current application information as all admissions criteria is subject to change for future application periods.

### **SLCC ADMISSION PROCESS**

- 1. Apply to SLCC as a degree-seeking student and declare Health Sciences as your Area of Study, and Mortuary Science as the Program of Study. Due to the selective admission process, you will be declared as a Pre-Health Sciences-AS student with a concentration in Mortuary Science (MORT) as you work through the pre-admissions requirements.
- 2. For transfer credit, complete all the required steps in the <u>SLCC Transfer Evaluation process</u>. Be sure to submit transcripts for ALL colleges and universities where prerequisite coursework and prior degrees have been completed. *This process may take 4-6 weeks or longer and must be completed before a student's application will be considered so plan accordingly.*
- Complete <u>SLCC Placement Process</u> or submit current SAT/ACT test scores if MATH and ENGL coursework have not been transferred to SLCC.
- 4. Schedule an appointment with your <u>Mortuary Science Academic Advisor online</u> or call 801-957-6215. Students are encouraged to meet regularly with the Mortuary Science advisor.
- 5. ALL communication will be through BruinMail.

### **MORTUARY SCIENCE APPLICATION PROCESS**

Items 1-5 **must** be completed for students to be eligible to apply to the Mortuary Science Program. Items 7-11 are optional admissions criteria that may give an applicant extra consideration in the application process. **All support documentation must be uploaded to the application portal at the time of applying.** Applicants will not be able to make changes to their application or upload documents after application is submitted. The Health Sciences Admissions Office will not accept documents via email except for the documentation needed to verify anticipated final grade for prerequisite courses in progress at the time of application.

# 1. Mandatory Academic Prerequisites

Prerequisite courses are required before starting the program but <u>may be in progress</u> when submitting the application. Students who are in progress with these courses during the application period should plan to apply well before the application deadline since they will need to have their professor(s) verify their anticipated final grade for the prerequisites course(s) that have not yet been completed but are in-progress. The prerequisite courses must be completed with a **C grade or better except for Mort 1010 which must be completed with a B or better.**

### 2. Verification of High School Graduation

Verification of high school graduation or equivalent (GED) will be required. Documentation may include a transcript, diploma, or a letter of explanation of why documentation cannot be provided.

### 3. Job Shadow

It is required to shadow a licensed Funeral Director for at least 4 hours prior to applying to the Mortuary Sciences program. Employment at a funeral home, under a licensed Funeral Director, may be counted. The required <a href="Mortuary Science Job">Mortuary Science Job</a> <a href="Shadow Verification form">Shadow Verification form</a> must be completed with the Funeral Director who oversaw the shadowing/employment prior to applying.

### 4. Driver's License

Applicants must have a valid driver's license and be able to drive a standard vehicle.

### 5. Submit Online Health Sciences Application

To apply, log in to your "MySLCC" portal >> Click on "Discover" (Found on the top left under the 3 horizontal lines next to the SLCC logo) >> Type in "Selective Admissions Forms >> Click on "Start Here" under Health Sciences Programs if you're a first time applicant >> Click on "here" under apply to open admissions sessions if you've already registered for the Health Sciences Admissions Portal >> Choose Mortuary Science in the application

The Mortuary Science online application will only appear on the menu during open application periods. There is a non-refundable application fee of \$25. Up to **24** students are accepted every Spring Semester. This program requires full-time day attendance.

### 6. Multiple Mini-Interview (MMI) and Mandatory Information Session

After the application and prior to acceptance, qualified candidates will be contacted via Bruinmail to complete a Multiple Mini Interview (MMI) and attend a *mandatory* information session at the Jordan Campus. Qualified candidates will be sent further information via email from the Health Sciences Admissions team.

### 7. Complete Program Support Courses

The following support courses are required to graduate from the Mortuary Science program but can be taken while in the program. However, students who complete the required support courses before applying to the Mortuary Science program will receive additional consideration on their application. All courses must be completed with a **C grade or better**.

### 8. Employment with Funeral Home

Although not required, employment with a funeral home is encouraged prior to applying to the program. Applicants who submit a signed letter from employer, on employer letterhead that states job title and duration of employment will receive additional consideration on the application. Work experience must be for 3 months or longer but does not have to be current.

### 9. Graduated from an Area Health Education Center (AHEC) program

Applicants who have graduated from an AHEC program in the last 5 years will receive additional consideration on the Mortuary Science program application.

### 10. Community Engagement

Applicants who have demonstrated a willingness to serve others through volunteer community engagement will receive additional consideration on their application. Engagement should have occurred within the last 5 years and since high school graduation without payment or reward. Continual experiences and service engagement with underserved groups or populations are encouraged. Only one experience will be considered for the application. To demonstrate this was completed, applicants should provide a letter of recommendation from the mentor that supervised community engagement which includes the type of service, length of time committed to service and where the service was performed.

### 11. Prior Degrees

Additional consideration will be given to students for the highest degree earned prior to applying to the Mortuary Sciences program. Official transcripts showing prior degree must be sent to SLCC through the Transfer Evaluation process to be considered.

### 12. Veteran Status

Additional consideration will be given to students who are Veterans who are verified through the VA Office.

### **AFTER PROGRAM ACCEPTANCE**

- American DataBank Complio: Students are required to create an American DataBank Complio account to order theirbackground check, submit necessary documentation, and meet immunization compliance requirements, associated fees applicable to each package. - 2. Immunizations: Order "Immunization Compliance Package" from American DataBank Complio.
  - a. If accepted into the program, this subscription will need to be renewed every 12 months while in the program.
  - b. For specific information, please see the "After You're Accepted Into The Program" section under the desired program on the <u>Health Sciences Admissions website</u>.
  - c. Immunization requirements are subject to change, therefore check the website often and far enough in advance to be able to accommodate deadlines. For questions on immunizations, please contact 801-957-6253 or healthsciencesadmissions@slcc.edu.
  - d. Required immunizations officially documented and uploaded into American DataBank Complio:
    - i. Annual Tuberculosis (see HS website)
    - ii. Hepatitis B (Series and titer may take up to 1 year, so start well in advance)
    - iii. COVID-19
- 3. Background Check: Order "Criminal Background Check Package" through American Databank Complio.
  - a. Students assume the risk if their criminal background check is not clear. If students do not pass the background check, they may not be accepted into the program. This may result in withdrawal from the program after the tuition refund deadline has passed. The clinical site will make the final determination about accepting students for clinical placement.

- b. It is **strongly** recommended that prospective students take measures to have criminal offenses <u>expunged</u> or sealed from their record if possible. Students can review <u>Criminal History Guidelines on DOPL's website</u>. Students are advised to contact the <u>Health Sciences Admissions Coordinator</u> with any questions or concerns prior to applying to the program.
- 4. **Drug Screening**: Order "Drug Screening Package" through American DataBank Complio.
  - a. You will have 48 hours to complete the test once ordered.

# **Program Hours**

Courses in the Mortuary Science program are typically taught two days a week at varying days and times depending on the semester. Courses in the program typically start as early as 6 am or 7 am and end between 3 pm and 5 pm depending on the semester and the section of labs students are placed into. Course times may also depend upon program and clinical site needs and may vary based on program director and faculty discretion.

### **National Board Exam and Licensing Information**

Students must complete both sections of the official National Board Exam to qualify for licensure. In addition to graduating from the Mortuary Science AAS program, students planning to work as funeral directors *in Utah* are required to complete at least 2,000 hours and 50 embalmings under the supervision of a licensed funeral service director over a period of not less than one year as well as obtain a passing score on the above-mentioned examination.
