Apprenticeship Electrical Independent—Licensure Information

The <u>SLCC Apprenticeship Electrical Independent</u> is designed to prepare students to apply for professional licensure through the <u>Utah Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing (DOPL)</u>. To be eligible for Journeyman Electrician licensure in Utah, an apprentice must complete 576 minimum hours of related instruction and four years and 8,000 hours of on-the-job training (OJT). The SLCC Apprenticeship Electrical Independent program is registered with the US Department of Labor.

This document represents a good faith effort to describe licensure requirements in other states. Please recognize that there may be additional requirements for licensure not outlined in this document. Licensure and employment requirements vary by state, agency, and organization. In additional to the requirements listed below, applicants may be asked to submit criminal background checks, pay licensure fees or other certification fees, abide by codes of conduct, or other requirements not outlined in this document. We recommend that students who are planning to move out of Utah research licensure requirements in other states.

Once an applicant earns a Journeyman Electrician license in Utah, the applicant may be eligible for licensure reciprocity in a few other states. Applying for licensure through reciprocity means that the applicant usually does not need to retake the licensure exam in the new state.
