Fall 2026 Cohort Selective Admissions Requirements

All prerequisites must be completed before applying to the Physical Therapist Assistant program, or if currently enrolled in a prerequisite course, official grades must be posted to your SLCC Degree Works transcript before the application deadline. If you are waiting for transfer courses to be evaluated, you can submit your application materials and then admissions will add the grades once they are available prior to the application deadline.

The courses listed below must be completed with a C grade or better except for BIOL 2320 / BIOL 2325 and PTA 1010, which must be completed with a B grade or better. Courses below do not have a time frame or attempt restrictions except for (1) PTA 1010 is limited to *three attempts* within *seven years* prior to the start of the program, and (2) BIOL 2320/ BIOL 2325 is limited to *three attempts* within five years prior to the start of the program.

Pre-requisite courses will total a maximum of 40% of the overall admissions score; with overall GPA at 12% and Science courses (PTA 1010 and BIOL 2320 & 2325) compromising 28% of the overall admissions score.

IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT TRANSFER CREDIT

- It is the applicant's responsibility to make sure their transfer credit has been fully transferred to SLCC prior to the program's application deadlines.
- If a student has courses they are transferring from another school, their transcripts must be evaluated by the SLCC Transfer Evaluation Office and their grades must be posted to SLCC DegreeWorks (their MySLCC account), before the program's application deadline (priority and final application deadlines apply). IT CAN TAKE SEVERAL WEEKS FOR TRANSCRIPTS TO BE EVALUATED.
- Students should declare Health Sciences as their Area of Study and Physical Therapist
 Assistant as the Program of Study when applying to SLCC. If the program of study does
 not match the information submitted on the transfer evaluation request, courses
 applicable to the program may not be transferred to SLCC.

VERIFICATION OF HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION OR EQUIVALENT (GED)

Proof of high school graduation is required to apply. Documentation may include a transcript, diploma, or a letter of explanation if you do not have supporting documentation. **You will be required to upload this information as part of your application.**

HESI HEALTH SCIENCES PRE-ADMISSION EXAM

HESI score will total a maximum of 14% of the overall admissions score.

- Tests must be scheduled at least one week in advance.
- You must pass with a minimum overall score of 75%.
- To raise your score, you may retake the exam after a two-week remediation period. You
 may take the exam a total of three times with no expiration date.

Applicants are *highly* encouraged to take the HESI at an SLCC Testing Center, as proctoring at other locations may be limited or subject to technical issues. Exceptions cannot be made for applicants who experience issues with proctored exams.

INTERVIEW

A Standardized Video Interview (SVI) will be conducted after submission of your application. A link to complete the SVI online will be sent within five business days after receiving your application.

SVI will total a maximum of 28% of the overall admissions score.

PREFERRED BUT NOT REQUIRED

Applicants who submit documentation showing the following experiences may be given extra consideration for the program if they have fulfilled all the program application requirements.

- Graduated from an AHEC program or completed a MA or CNA certification within the last five years or LMT degree (5% of the overall admissions score) – Must submit certification or degree documentation.
- Community Engagement (4% of the overall admissions score) Applicants who have
 demonstrated a willingness to serve others through volunteer community engagement
 will receive additional consideration on their application. Community engagement can
 be volunteering at food banks, homeless shelters, emergency assistance programs,
 neighborhood cleanup programs, etc.

Community Engagement Criteria:

- Engagement should have occurred within the last five years and since high school graduation
- Must be performed within the state of Utah
- Continual experiences encouraged
- Must be served without payment or reward
- Service engagement with underserved groups or populations is encouraged
- Only one experience will be considered for the application

Submit a letter of recommendation from the mentor who supervised community engagement as part of your application. The letter must discuss the type of service, length of time committed to serving, and where the service was performed.

Extra consideration will be given for students with the following:

- Prior Associates and/or Bachelor's degree. Degree(s) must be posted on official college transcript (4% of the overall admissions score)
- Verified Veteran's status through the Veteran's Service office. (5% of the overall admissions score)

Any document or information you wish to have considered on your application must be uploaded while completing your application. Additional documentation cannot be considered once you have submitted your application.
