A Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA) is a healthcare provider working with individuals and their families under the supervision of a Physical Therapist (PT) in providing client care by applying a variety of therapy treatments in different healthcare settings. Treatment techniques include therapeutic exercises, heat, cold, electrotherapy, hydrotherapy, traction and massage. The PTA will be involved in modification of treatment programs, client/family education and discharge planning under the direction of a PT. Healthcare settings where a PTA may work include hospitals, extended care facilities, rehabilitation centers, outpatient facilities, sports medicine clinics, work hardening programs, schools and homes.

WHY SLCC?

In addition to regular studies, students participate in the onsite SLCC "pro-bono" clinic, providing therapy to need-based individuals and others from the community.

ADMISSION PROCESS

- Must be 18 years of age at time of entry into the program.
- · Be admitted to SLCC as a matriculated student.
- Request an official evaluation of transcripts and submit to the SLCC Incoming Transcript Office, if applicable.
- Application information including prerequisites, transcripts, deadlines, Health Sciences pre-admission exam and written essay can be found at: slcc.edu/hs/admissions
- · HESI pre-admission exam.
- · Written essay.

PREREQUISITES Note: All prerequisites must be completed before applying to the Physical Therapist Assistant program. The following prerequisites must be completed with a C grade or better:

- PSY1100 Human Growth/Dev Across the Lifespan^(SS) (3) / OR FHS1500 Family and Human Studies (SS) (3)
- ENGL 1010 Intro to Writing* or any Composition (EN) Course^ (EN) (3) APA section
- MA 1100 Medical Terminology (3)
- MATH 1040 (QL)(3) or Math 1050**^(4)

The following prerequisites must be completed with a B grade or better, note course limit attempts and time frame restrictions below:

- BIOL 2320/2325 Human Anatomy Lecture/Lab (4)
 (IfyouaretakingHumanAnatomyatSLCC,youmust complete
 BIOL 1610/1615 first with a C grade or better.)
 (Limited to 3 attempts within 5 years prior to the start of the
 program)
- PTA 1010 Intro to Physical Therapy (3) (Limited to 3 attempts within 7 years prior to the start of the program)

It is the student's responsibility to examine each course description for details of other prerequisite courses, if any.

THE CURRICULUM

The PTA program provides both general and technical education. The program consists of four semesters of PTA coursework in addition to the prerequisite courses.

Upon successful completion, graduates are awarded an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree. Graduates are able to sit for the national examination for Physical Therapist Assistants, which is required for licensure in Utah.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- · One cohort of 24 students is admitted every fall semester.
- Accepted students must take the PTA courses in the order outlined in the curriculum. To remain in the program, students must complete the PTA courses with a C (77%) grade or better in each required course.
- · All PTA courses are taught during the day.
- Students may come in contact with blood-borne pathogens and infectious diseases and all students in the PTA program must follow proper OSHA procedures and practice universal precautions.
- Prior to the first day of class you will be invited to join an orientation Canvas course that is required before starting classes.
- Accepted students must complete program required immunizations and certifications before clinical placements.
- Students will be responsible to provide their own transportation to clinical sites.
