School of Health Sciences Physical Therapist Assistant-Associate of Applied Science Admission Criteria for Fall 2024



Applicants are selected annually using a merit-based/competitive admission process. The program accepts **24 students** every fall semester. Applying does not guarantee admission. It is the student's responsibility to be aware of the most current <u>admissions</u> <u>criteria</u>. Please see the <u>Health Sciences Admissions website</u> for the current application information. The PTA Associate of Applied Science degree at Salt Lake Community College is **not** meant to prepare students for a Bachelor's degree nor does it lead to a graduate level degree to earn a Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT). Students seeking to eventually earn a DPT degree should meet with an academic advisor in the <u>Science, Engineering and Math Pathway</u> for appropriate course planning. The PTA AAS degree prepares students to obtain specific skills and competencies to take the NPTE exam for physical therapist assistants and to become licensed to work as a physical therapist assistant.

SLCC ADMISSIONS PROCESS

- 1. <u>Apply to SLCC</u> as a degree seeking student and declare Health Sciences as your Area of Study and Physical Therapist Assistant as the Program of Study. Due to the selective admission process, you will be declared as a Pre-Health Sciences-AS student with a concentration in Physical Therapist Assistant. The Pre-health sciences degree is as a placeholder degree while preparing to enter the PTA program.
- 2. Verification of high school graduation or equivalent (GED) will be required before the Physical Therapist Assistant admissions deadline. Send official high school transcripts or proof of GED to <u>HighSchoolTranscripts@slcc.edu</u>.
- 3. For transfer credit, complete all the required steps in the <u>SLCC Transfer Evaluation process</u>. Be sure to submit transcripts for ALL colleges and universities where prerequisite coursework has been completed. *This process may take 4-6 weeks and must be completed before a student's application will be considered*.
- 4. Complete <u>SLCC Placement Process</u> or submit current SAT/ACT test scores if MATH and ENGL course work have not been transferred to SLCC. <u>Placement process preparation</u>.
- 5. Schedule an appointment with your <u>PTA Academic Advisor online</u> or call 801-957-6215. Students are encouraged to meet regularly with their PTA advisor.
- 6. ALL communication will be through BruinMail. Can access Bruinmail through MySLCC portal.

PTA PROGRAM ADMISSION PROCESS

Items 1 thru 4 must be completed **before** applying to the program. Items 5 and 6 list criteria that are preferred but not required to apply.

1. Mandatory Prerequisite Courses

ALL prerequisites must be completed with the minimum grades BEFORE applying to the Physical Therapist Assistant program. Courses may not be in progress. Depending on the student's academic preparation, additional prerequisite courses may be required. It is the student's responsibility to examine each course description for details of other prerequisite courses required. See the application deadline in the important dates section below and plan to meet with your academic advisor to create a course plan and determine a timeline for applying.

ADVISING NOTE: Sample schedule does not replace professional academic advising. Individual needs may differ. Students should meet with their assigned program advisor on a regular basis to discuss course planning.

2. High School Diploma or Equivalent (GED)

Verification of high school graduation or equivalent (GED) will be required before the Physical Therapist Assistant admissions deadline. Send official high school transcripts or proof of GED to <u>HighSchoolTranscripts@slcc.edu</u>.

3. HESI Exam

Students must complete the HESI Pre-Admission Assessment Test by the admissions deadline. A **minimum overall score of 75% is required**. There is a **limit of three (3) attempts with no expiration date**. Students are required to wait a minimum of two (2) weeks before retesting. The **highest score** of the three (3) attempts will be used; there is no averaging of the scores. Test must be scheduled at least one week in advance, so plan accordingly.

The areas tested include: Anatomy & Physiology, Biology, Math, Grammar, Reading Comprehension, and Vocabulary. Below are details on how to register:

4. Admissions Essay

Applicants will submit an admissions essay as an email attachment from their Bruinmail account to <u>HealthSciencesAdmissions@slcc.edu</u> by the application deadline. Read the <u>Selective Admissions Criteria</u> for the essay prompt and formatting requirements.

5. Preferred (But Not Required) Items.

- Completion of a Utah Area Health Education Centers (AHEC) program or CNA and/or Medical Assistant certification within the past 5 years or Licensed Massage Therapist degree. Must submit copy of certification or degree to <u>HealthSciencesAdmissions@slcc.edu</u>.
- Prior Associate's and/or Bachelor's degree will be given additional consideration in the application process. Prior degree(s) should be posted on official college transcript(s) sent to SLCC.
- Applicants that have demonstrated a willingness to serve others through volunteer community engagement will receive additional consideration on their application. Read the <u>Selective Admissions Criteria</u> for more information.

6. Veterans

Veterans verified through the <u>Veteran Services Office</u> will be given additional consideration in the application process.

7. Apply Online

Application access instructions:

Log-in to "MySLCC">Click on "Discover" (Found on the top left under the 3 horizontal lines next to the SLCC logo) >Type in and click on "Selective Admissions Forms">Click on "Health Science Program Admissions". There is a non-refundable application fee of \$25. The Physical Therapist Assistant online application will only appear on the menu during open application periods.

Essential Functions. As part of the application process, applicants must acknowledge they are able to perform all the essential functions of the program without or with reasonable accommodations. Some of the essential functions include performing specific physical tasks. Review the <u>PTA Essential Functions Document</u> for more details. Sign and date the Essential Functions form and submit to HealthSciencesAdmissions@slcc.edu.

Applicants should check their Bruinmail account regularly for notices from the Health Sciences Admissions Office.

The Physical Therapist Assistant program accepts up to **24** students every fall semester.

AFTER PROGRAM ACCEPTANCE

Acceptance into the program will be given on a "Conditional" basis. Students must complete the following within the allotted time in their "Conditional Acceptance" letter (about 30 days) to receive "Full Acceptance". **If students don't complete these requirements, they will forfeit their spot.** Once "Full Acceptance" is granted, students can register for Physical Therapist Assistant classes.

 American DataBank Complio: Students are required to create an American DataBank Complio account to order their background check, submit necessary documentation, and meet immunization compliance requirements. Create an account by going to: <u>https://saltlakecc.complio.com/</u>

- 2. Immunizations: Order "Immunization Compliance Package" from American DataBank Complio, \$15.
 - a. This subscription will need to be renewed every 12 months while in the program for \$15.
 - b. For specific information, please see the "After You're Accepted Into The Program" section under the desired program on the <u>Health Sciences Admissions website</u>.
 - c. Immunization requirements are subject to change, therefore check the website often and far enough in advance to be able to accommodate deadlines. For questions on immunizations, please contact 801-957-6253 or <u>healthsciencesadmissions@slcc.edu</u>.
 - d. Required immunizations officially documented and uploaded into American DataBank Complio:
 - i. Annual Influenza Vaccination
 - ii. Annual Tuberculosis (see HS website)
 - iii. Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis (Tdap)
 - iv. Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
 - v. Varicella (Chicken Pox)
 - vi. Hepatitis B (Series and titer may take up to 1 year, so start well in advance)
 - vii. Hepatitis A vaccination series (highly recommended but not required)
 - viii. COVID-19
- 3. Background Check: Order "Criminal Background Check Package" through American Databank Complio, \$29
 - a. Students assume the risk if their criminal background check is not clear. If students do not pass the background check, they may not be accepted into the program. This may result in withdrawal from the program after the tuition refund deadline has passed. The clinical site will make the final determination about accepting students for clinical placement.
 - b. It is strongly recommended that prospective students take measures to have criminal offenses <u>expunged</u> or sealed from their record if possible. Students can review <u>Criminal History Guidelines on DOPL's website</u>. Students are advised to contact the <u>Health Sciences Admissions Coordinator</u> with any questions or concerns prior to applying to the program.
- 4. CPR Certification: Documentation uploaded into American DataBank Complio account
 - a. Current <u>American Heart Association</u> OR <u>American Red Cross</u> 2-year BLS Healthcare Provider certification. BLS (CPR) Certification may be obtained at any certified provider. **Students will need to ensure their BLS (CPR) certification is current throughout the program.**
- 5. Drug Screening: Order "Drug Screening Package" through American DataBank Complio, \$35
 - a. You will have 48 hours to complete the test once ordered.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The program consists of four (4) consecutive semesters after prerequisites, including a summer semester. All accepted students will be enrolled on a full-time basis while in the PTA program. The program consists of theory, skill-based, and clinical courses. The program content is rigorous and presented in an accelerated manner. Students will attend clinical instruction during the summer and second fall semesters of the program. The facilities have two therapy labs, a cadaver lab, a therapy pool, and personal lockers for students.

Program Hours & Minimum Grades

Classes are typically taught during the day only M-TH from 8:00 a.m.-4:30 p.m. at the <u>Jordan Campus</u>, except for when students are in clinical settings during the summer semester and the second fall semester. The student's clinical schedule will be determined by the clinical site. Student will be expected to participate in three (3) clinical internships. Attendance for clinical internships will be five (5) days a week, forty (40) hours per week. Student should expect each clinical internship to last five (5) to six (6) weeks. For more clinical information, visit <u>PTA clinicals</u>. Clinical sites have discretion over who they accept for clinical instruction. To integrate classroom and skill-based learning with real-life, students are also expected participate in an on-site <u>pro-bono physical therapy clinic</u>.

To maintain their position in the PTA program, students must maintain a **C (77%) grade or better** in each required class and complete the technical curriculum in the order outlined.

National Exam

Licensure is required to practice as a physical therapist assistant in the State of Utah. Upon successful completion of the program, graduates are awarded the AAS degree (Associates of Applied Science) which allows students to sit for the National Physical Therapy Exam (NPTE) for Physical Therapist Assistant through the Federation of State Boards in Physical Therapy (<u>fsbpt.org</u>). If a student passes the exam, they will be eligible for licensure/registration in all states. For state licensure information, visit <u>www.dopl.utah.gov</u>.
