

FALL 2024 COHORT SELECTIVE ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

All prerequisites must be completed before applying to the Radiologic Technology program. You must earn a grade of B- or better in BIOL 2320/2325. The other prerequisites must be completed with a C grade or better. All prerequisites have a limit of two attempts every 5 years. The highest grade of the two attempts will be used.

Please note that the SLCC Radiologic Technology program does not accept transfer credit from any other Radiologic Technology program.

IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT TRANSFER CREDIT

- It is the applicant's responsibility to make sure their transfer credit has been fully transferred to SLCC prior to the program's application deadlines.
- If a student has courses they are transferring from another school, their transcripts must be evaluated by the SLCC Transfer Evaluation Office and their **grades must be posted to SLCC DegreeWorks (their MySLCC account) before** the program's application deadline (priority and final application deadlines apply). IT CAN TAKE SEVERAL WEEKS FOR TRANSCRIPTS TO BE EVALUATED.
- Students should declare Health Sciences as their Area of Study and Radiologic Technology as the Program of Study when applying to SLCC. If the program of study does not match the information submitted on the transfer evaluation request, courses applicable to the program may not be transferred to SLCC.

VERIFICATION OF HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION OR EQUIVALENT (GED)

Verification of high school graduation or equivalent (GED) will be required before the (program) admissions deadline. Send official high school transcripts to HighSchoolTranscripts@slcc.edu.

ESSAY

Each applicant must email an electronic copy of their essay to the Health Sciences Admissions Office at healthsciencesadmissions@slcc.edu by the program's application deadline.

ESSAY FORM

Your essay will be judged based on the following criteria:

- Content Development:
 - The clarity, thoroughness, and relevant detail that the applicant uses to answer the essay questions.
- Analysis Connections:
 - Connects experiences and skills learned from your healthcare and/or customer service interactions and its relationship to patient care in the field of radiography.
- Healthcare/Customer Service Interactions:
 - Type and length of job experiences with duties performed. You may include volunteer/observation experience in healthcare, customer service interaction, and work in healthcare with either direct or indirect patient contact.
- Grammar, Spelling & Punctuation:
 - Demonstrate proper use and understanding of grammar, spelling, and punctuation.

INTERVIEWS

Multiple mini-interviews (MMI's) will be conducted for top-ranking applicants after the admissions session has closed. The number of applicants interviewed will be based on the available number of clinical spots and then doubled. Notifications will go out to those eligible to be interviewed within 10 days of the admissions session closing. Interviews will be conducted in-person, eligible applicants must be available to attend an interview session mid-February 2024.

PREFERRED BUT NOT REQUIRED

Applicants who submit documentation showing the following experiences of at least 3 months or more may be given extra consideration for the program if they have fulfilled all the program application requirements.

- **Worked in customer service** – Must submit a signed letter from your employer (on letterhead) that states your job title and the duration of your employment.
- **Worked in healthcare without hands-on patient care or volunteered only within the last 5 years** - Must submit a signed letter from your employer (on letterhead) that states your job title and the duration of your employment.
- **Worked in healthcare with direct, hands-on patient care within the last 5 years** - Must submit a signed letter from your employer (on letterhead) that states your job title and the duration of your employment.

Applicants who submit documentation showing the following experiences may be given extra consideration for the program if they have fulfilled all the program application requirements.

- **Time spent observing or shadowing, in a radiology setting within last 5 years** - Must provide documentation verifying shadowing hours to count these points.
- **Radiologic Practical Technician work experience** – Must submit a signed letter from your employer (on letterhead) that states your job title and the duration of your employment.
- **Graduated from an AHEC program or completed a MA or CNA certification within the last five years** – Must submit certification.
- **Community Engagement** - Applicants that have demonstrated a willingness to serve others through volunteer community engagement will receive additional consideration on their application. Community engagement can be volunteering at food banks, homeless shelters, emergency assistance programs, neighborhood cleanup programs, etc.

Community Engagement Criteria:

- Engagement should have occurred within the last five years and since high school graduation
- Must be performed within the state of Utah
- Continual experiences encouraged
- Must be served without payment or reward
- Service engagement with underserved groups or populations is encouraged
- Only one experience will be considered for the application

Submit a letter of recommendation from the mentor that supervised community engagement to healthsciencesadmissions@slcc.edu. The letter should discuss type of service, length of time committed to serving and where service was performed.

Documentation must be submitted to the Health Sciences Admissions Office within five business days of submitting your application (application deadlines still apply). You may email your documentation to healthsciencesadmissions@slcc.edu, or drop it off in person at the Jordan Campus at 3491 W Wights Fort Rd, JHS 065, West Jordan UT.

HEP B IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENT

Students conditionally accepted into the Radiologic Technology Program must be able to provide proof of immunity by way of titer or non-responder status to Hepatitis B no later than May 1st, 2024. For students not immune after an initial series, the repeat process can take 3-7 months depending on series given and a repeat titer. It is strongly encouraged that students be aware of their immunity status and plan accordingly to meet the deadline. Students unable to provide a final immunity status by May 1st, 2024, will have their conditional acceptance offer withdrawn.
