Fall 2027 Cohort | Selective Admissions Requirements

Before you apply

Complete all prerequisites, verify transfer credit, gather every supporting document, complete the required Situational Judgement Test (SJT), and review the interview dates before submitting your application.

1. Complete the prerequisites

All prerequisite courses must be completed before you apply.

- BIOL 2320/2325: B- or higher and completed within the last five years.
- All other prerequisites: C or higher.
- All prerequisites: no more than two attempts within five years. The highest grade from the two attempts will be used.

Program transfer-credit restriction

The SLCC Radiologic Technology program does not accept transfer credit from another Radiologic Technology program.

Corequisite note: Applicants are encouraged to complete corequisites before applying. Additional consideration may be given for completion of any COMM course and HS 2050 or any HR course when minimum grade requirements are met at the time of application.

2. If you have transfer credit

- Declare Health Sciences as your Area of Study and Radiologic Technology as your Program of Study when applying to SLCC. If the program of study does not match the information submitted on the transfer evaluation request, courses applicable to the program may not be transferred to SLCC.
- Complete the [Transfer Evaluation process](#).
- Ensure all transfer credit is evaluated and posted in DegreeWorks before the program application deadline. Evaluation can take several weeks.

3. Upload proof of high school completion

You will be required to upload proof of high school graduation or a GED as part of your application. Acceptable documentation may include a transcript, diploma, or a letter of explanation if supporting documentation is unavailable.

4. Complete the required SJT

The Situational Judgement Test (SJT) is required before application submission. It includes 30 ethical-based scenarios and has a one-hour time limit.

- Testing window: October 1 through January 15.
- Take the SJT during the open application session at an SLCC Testing Center.
- Only one attempt is allowed during the open application cycle. Additional attempts will disqualify the application.
- Applications submitted without a completed SJT will not be considered, and a second application submission will not be allowed.
- Final SJT scores are not provided to applicants.

Schedule the SJT

- Log in to MySLCC and open the Testing Services tile.
- If the tile is not visible, use Discover or Discover More, search for testing, and pin Testing Services to the MySLCC home page.
- Choose a Testing Center: Redwood, Jordan, South City, or Herriman.
- In RegisterBlast, select Health Science Pre-Admission and then the Rad Tech test. Register only for the Rad Tech assessment; choosing the wrong exam will invalidate the results.
- Add the exam to the cart and select Complete Registration.
- Use the confirmation sent to BruinMail to self-enroll in the Canvas course before arriving to take the SJT.

5. Optional items for additional consideration

Applicants who submit documentation showing the following experiences of at least 3 months or more may be given extra consideration for the program if they have fulfilled all the program application requirements.

Employment experience

- Customer service employment.
- Healthcare work without direct patient care, or related volunteer experience, within the last five years.
- Healthcare work involving direct, hands-on patient care within the last five years.
- Radiologic Practical Technician work experience.

Documentation: Submit a signed employer letter on letterhead listing your job title and length of employment.

Observation or shadowing

Observation or shadowing in an x-ray, non-modality setting within the last five years may be considered.

Required: [Submit the Radiologic Technology shadowing form](#) with the application to verify hours.

Reflection Statement

You may also upload a meaningful statement about what you learned, how the observation or shadowing experience affected you, or anything else meaningful for consideration. *Statements will be evaluated for AI-generated content and those determined to have been written using AI will not receive consideration in the review process.* Statements will not be scored for word count, but please keep statements under 400 words. Upload with the observation form.

AHEC, MA, or CNA experience

Graduation from an AHEC program or completion of a Medical Assistant (MA) or Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) certification within the last five years may be considered. Upload the certification.

Community engagement

One unpaid volunteer community engagement experience may be considered. Examples include service with food banks, homeless shelters, emergency assistance programs, or neighborhood cleanup programs.

- Occurred within the last five years and after high school graduation.
- Completed in Utah.
- Unpaid and without reward.
- Continual service is encouraged.
- Service with underserved groups or populations is encouraged.
- Only one experience will be considered.

Required verification: Upload a recommendation letter from the supervising mentor describing the type of service, location, and length of commitment.

Reflection Statement

You may also upload a meaningful statement about what you learned, how the community engagement experience affected you, or anything else meaningful for consideration. *Statements will be evaluated for AI-generated content and those determined to have been written using AI will not receive consideration in the review process.* Statements will not be scored for word count, but please keep statements under 400 words. Upload the statement with the recommendation letter.

Upload before submitting

Upload every document or piece of information you want considered while completing the application. Additional documentation cannot be considered after submission.

6. Interview process

Standardized Video Interview (SVI)

- Top-ranking applicants may be invited after the admissions session closes.
- Notifications will be sent within 10 days after the admissions session closes.
- The SVI is online and must be completed before the MMI. Instructions will be sent to the email address used to apply.

Multiple Mini-Interview (MMI)

- Top-ranking applicants may be invited after the admissions session closes.
- Interview dates: February 23-25, 2027.

- MMIs are in person. Eligible applicants must select a one-hour time slot on one of the scheduled dates.
- Exceptions cannot be made. Confirm your availability before submitting the application.

7. Hepatitis B immunity requirement

Students accepted into the program must provide proof of Hepatitis B immunity by titer, or provide non-responder status, no later than July 1, 2027. Students who cannot provide final immunity status by that date will have their acceptance offer withdrawn.

Plan early

For students who are not immune after an initial series, the repeat process and titer may take 3-7 months depending on the series given. Check your immunity status early.
