

School of Health Sciences Respiratory Therapy Associate of Applied Science Admission Criteria for Fall 2026

Applicants are selected on a merit based, competitive admission process. Application does not guarantee admission. See the Health Sciences Admissions website for current application information.

SLCC ADMISSION PROCESS

- 1. Apply to SLCC as a degree seeking student & declare Health Sciences as your Area of Study, & Respiratory Therapy as the Program of Study. Due to the selective admission process, you will be placed in a holding degree and declared as a Pre-Health Sciences-AS student.
- 2. For transfer credit, complete all the required steps in the <u>SLCC Transfer Evaluation process</u>. Be sure to submit transcripts for ALL colleges and universities where prerequisite coursework has been completed. *This process may take 4-6 weeks and must be completed before a student's application will be considered.*
- 3. Complete <u>SLCC Placement Process</u> or submit current SAT/ACT test scores if MATH and ENGL course work have not been transferred to SLCC.
- 4. Schedule appointment with the <u>Respiratory Therapy Academic Advisor online</u> or call 801-957-6215. Students are encouraged to meet regularly with the Respiratory Therapy advisor.
- 5. ALL communication will be through SLCC BruinMail.

RESPIRATORY THERAPY PROGRAM ADMISSION PROCESS

1. Mandatory Prerequisite Courses

The following program prerequisite courses require a minimum grade of **C or better**. BIOL 2320/2325, BIOL 2420/2425 & CHEM 1110 must be completed within **seven years prior to application** to the program:

*NOTE: If you are taking Human Anatomy and/or Human Physiology at SLCC, you must first take BIOL 1610/1615 w/C grade or better. CHEM 1110 is also a prerequisite course to Human Physiology at SLCC and must be completed with a C grade or better. Students transferring in with Human Physiology completed within the past seven years, CHEM 1010 can substitute for CHEM 1110.

2. Required Support Courses

The following courses are **not** required for application but **are required for graduation** and must be completed with a grade of **C or better**. Students who have not completed these courses prior to acceptance may complete them during the planned scheduled semester of the program.

3. Verification of high school graduation or equivalent (GED)

You will be required to verify high school graduation or equivalent, and documentation will be requested when you submit the Respiratory Therapy program application. You may upload a copy of your high school transcripts or diploma. If your high school transcripts have already been submitted to SLCC, you may make a note of that and upload the note into the application.

4. Essential Functions

Applicants must sign and date the <u>Essential Functions</u> document acknowledging they can perform the program's essential functions if admitted.

5. Preferred But Not Required

Applicants who submit documentation showing the following may be given extra consideration for the program if they have fulfilled all the program application requirements.

- Graduated from an AHEC program or completed a MA or CNA certification within the last five years Must submit certification.
- Community Engagement Applicants that have demonstrated a willingness to serve others through volunteer
 community engagement with receive additional consideration on their application. Community engagement
 can be volunteering at food banks, homeless shelters, emergency assistance programs, neighborhood cleanup
 programs, etc.

Community Engagement Criteria:

- Engagement should have occurred within the last five years and since high school graduation.
- Must be performed within the state of Utah.
- o Continual experiences encouraged.
- Must be served without payment or reward.
- Service engagement with underserved groups or populations is encouraged.
- Only one experience will be considered for the application.

Submit a letter of recommendation from the mentor that supervised community engagement. The letter should discuss type of service, length of time committed to serving and where service was performed.

6. Apply Online

On your MySLCC click on "Discover" (Found on the top left under the three horizontal lines next to the SLCC logo) type in "Selective Admissions Forms". Click on "start here" under Health Sciences Programs if you are a first-time applicant. Click on "here" under apply to open admissions sessions if you have already registered for the health sciences admissions portal. The respiratory therapy application will only appear on the menu during open application periods. There is a non-refundable application fee of \$40. Up to **25** students are accepted every fall semester.

ADVISING NOTE: Sample schedule does not replace professional academic advising, individual needs may differ. Students should meet with their assigned program advisor on a regular basis to discuss course planning.

AFTER PROGRAM ACCEPTANCE

Acceptance into the program will be given on a "Conditional" basis. Students must complete the following within the allotted time indicated in their "Conditional Acceptance" email letter (about 30 days) to receive "Full Acceptance". If students do not complete these requirements, they will forfeit their spot. Once "Full Acceptance" is granted, students can register for respiratory therapy courses.

1. American DataBank Complio: Students are required to create an American DataBank Complio account to order their background check, submit necessary documentation, and meet immunization compliance requirements. Create an account by going to: https://saltlakecc.complio.com/

- 2. **Immunizations:** <u>Required by clinical affiliates</u>. Order "Immunization Compliance Package" from American DataBank Complio, \$16.
 - a. If accepted into the program, this subscription will need to be renewed every 12 months while in the program for \$16.
 - b. For specific information, please see the "After You're Accepted Into The Program" section under the desired program on the Health Sciences Admissions website.
 - c. Immunization requirements are subject to change, therefore check the website often and far enough in advance to be able to accommodate deadlines. For questions on immunizations, please contact 801-957-6253 or healthsciencesadmissions@slcc.edu.
 - d. Required immunizations officially documented and uploaded into American DataBank Complio:

- i. Annual Influenza Vaccination
- ii. Annual Tuberculosis (See HS website)
- iii. Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis (Tdap)
- iv. Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR)
- v. Varicella (Chicken Pox)
- vi. Hepatitis B (Series and titer may take up to 1 year, so start well in advance)
- vii. Hepatitis A vaccination series (highly recommended but not required)
- viii. COVID (See HS website)
- 3. Background Check: Order "Criminal Background Check Package" through American Databank Complio, \$29
 - a. Students assume the risk if their criminal background check is not clear. If students do not pass the background check, they may not be accepted into the program. This may result in withdrawal from the program after the tuition refund deadline has passed. The clinical site will make the final determination about accepting students for clinical placement. If you do not receive a favorable background check, contact the Health Sciences Admissions Coordinator immediately.
 - b. It is **strongly** recommended that prospective students take measures to have criminal offenses <u>expunged</u> or sealed from their record. Students can review <u>Criminal History Guidelines on DOPL's website.</u> Students are advised to contact the <u>Health Sciences Admissions Coordinator</u> with any questions or concerns prior to applying to the program.
- 4. CPR Certification: Documentation uploaded into American DataBank Complio account
 - a. Current <u>American Heart Association BLS Healthcare Provider</u> (CPR) certification. American Red Cross will NOT be accepted. BLS (CPR) Certification may be obtained at any certified provider. Students will need to ensure their BLS (CPR) certification is current throughout the program.
- 5. Drug Screening: Order "Drug Screening Package" through American DataBank Complio, \$35
 Please do not initiate any of the compliance tasks unless you have received a conditional acceptance notification to the email address you provided on your Salt Lake Community College application.

Program Hours

The program is taught on the 12-week term and is a daytime program with classes typically taught morning through afternoon. Clinical practice hours in the 2nd, 3rd and 4th semesters will be scheduled during different days and times (may

include nights and/or weekends and will be determined by the clinical setting). Once accepted and enrolled into the respiratory therapy program, students are required to maintain a grade of B- in all respiratory therapy courses. If a student does not meet the minimum grade requirements the student will be given the opportunity to retake the course one time. Failure to meet the minimum grade requirement in either didactic or clinical will require a repeat of both courses concurrently. Courses are only offered once per year, so failure to achieve a B- (80%) in any course will require a change in cohort. If a student is dismissed from the program and wishes to return, they will need to reapply to the program. Attendance in class and clinical is mandatory.

National Exam

Upon successful completion of the core program, the graduate will be eligible to take the National Board for Respiratory Care Entry- Level Respiratory Care Practitioner Examination to become a Certified Respiratory Therapist, and the Advanced Level Respiratory Care Practitioner Examination to become a Registered Respiratory Therapist.

Accreditation

The Respiratory Therapy Program, 200630, Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree, Salt Lake Community College, Jordan Campus holds provisional accreditation from the Commission on Accreditation for Respiratory Care (CoARC).
