FALL 2024 COHORT SELECTIVE ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

Spring semester prerequisite courses may still be in progress when you submit your application. However, your application will not be considered complete and therefore no acceptance/denial will be determined until after the grades for the prerequisite courses have been posted. Your final grades will be assessed at the end of the semester and your acceptance into the program will be based on your grades being high enough to meet the program's selection requirements.

The following courses and labs (or equivalent transfer credit, AP or CLEP) must be completed prior to the final application deadline. Each course and lab must be completed, with a C grade or better. Courses that have not been completed with a C grade or better will not be considered. BIOL 2320/2325, 2420/2425 & CHEM 1110 must have been completed within seven years prior to application to the program.

***BIOL 1610 & 1615 are not required for transfer students who have previously completed Human Anatomy w/ Lab or Human Physiology w/Lab with a "C" grade, or better. **If you are taking BIOL 2320 & 2325 and/or BIOL 2420 & 2425 at SLCC, you must take BIOL 1610 & 1615 first.**

****CHEM 1110 is a required pre-requisite for BIOL 2420/BIOL 2425. Students transferring in with Human Physiology completed, CHEM 1010 is accepted.

IMPORTANT NOTES ABOUT TRANSFER CREDIT

- It is the applicant's responsibility to make sure their transfer credit has been fully transferred to SLCC prior to the program's application deadlines.
- If a student has courses they are transferring from another school, their transcripts must be evaluated by the SLCC Transfer Evaluation Office and their grades must be posted to SLCC DegreeWorks (their MySLCC account), before the program's application deadline (priority and final application deadlines apply). IT CAN TAKE SEVERAL WEEKS FOR TRANSCRIPTS TO BE EVALUATED.
- Students should declare Health Sciences as their Area of Study, and Respiratory Therapy as the Program of Study when applying to SLCC. If the correct information is not submitted within the transfer evaluation request, courses applicable to the program may not be transferred to SLCC.

VERIFICATION OF HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION OR EQUIVALENT (GED)

Verification of high school graduation or equivalent (GED) will be required before the (program) admissions deadline. Send official high school transcripts to <u>HighSchoolTranscripts@slcc.edu</u>.

PREFERRED BUT NOT REQUIRED

- Graduated from an AHEC program or completed a MA or CNA certification within the last five years – Must submit certification.
- **Community Engagement** Applicants that have demonstrated a willingness to serve others through volunteer community engagement will receive additional consideration on their application. Community engagement can be volunteering at food banks, homeless shelters, emergency assistance programs, neighborhood cleanup programs, etc.

Community Engagement Criteria:

- Engagement should have occurred within the last five years and since high school graduation
- Must be performed within the state of Utah
- Continual experiences encouraged
- Must be served without payment or reward
- Service engagement with underserved groups or populations is encouraged
- Only one experience will be considered for the application

Submit a letter of recommendation from the mentor that supervised community engagement to <u>healthsciencesadmissions@slcc.edu</u>. The letter should discuss type of service, length of time committed to serving and where service was performed.

SITUATIONAL JUDGEMENT TEST (SJT)

Applicants may be required to complete A Situational Judgement Test (SJT) after the admissions session has closed. The SJT is a proctored online assessment that must be completed within a designated time frame to be eligible to move forward for admissions consideration. Notifications will go out to those eligible to participate within 10 days of the admissions session closing.
