SLCC is excited to remake the Business Building on its Taylorville Redwood Campus, made possible by a generous \$10 million donation from the Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation. The 50,000 square-foot, 1980s-era building is no longer adequate for training tomorrow's business leaders. This donation allows the College to create a modern environment where students and members of the community can engage, collaborate and innovate, as well as provide the opportunity to reinvigorate academic programming in the School of Business.

To honor this largest-ever cash gift for the College, SLCC is renaming its Business Building the Larry H. & Gail Miller Family Foundation Business Building and its Business School the Gail Miller School of Business. The Gail Miller School of Business is the only business school in Utah and one of only a handful across the country named exclusively for a woman.

Building Transformation and Key Features

- Increase size by 18,900 feet
- Open atrium addition
- Expanded auditorium where students can present ideas to their instructors, peers and families
- Modernized conference rooms
- Kickstarter business incubation space for students to launch small businesses
- Improved and expanded Business Resource Instructional Center, SLCC's one-stop location providing academic, technology and advising support to more than 13,000 students per year
- Construction may begin in 18 months; target completion date is May 2026

Programming Improvements

- Formation of a Business Scholars Program where students create and implement projects that benefit the local community
- Programming changes will incorporate more entrepreneurship, service-based learning, and communitybased learning with local industry and non-profit learners
- New programming will be designed to increase engagement among SLCC business students, which improves attendance, retention and degree completion
