Community-Engaged Learning (CEL) blends reflection for deeper learning with community engagement into your coursework by providing opportunities for service with nonprofits, governmental, and/or educational community partners. CEL makes course content relevant and directly applicable to the real world putting you in a good position to transfer, apply to grad school or land that job! Here's how:



Build your network

Volunteer at a local school, build garden boxes at the YMCA or host an event to raise money for a cause close to you! The people you work with will be able to provide you a reference or may even hire you!



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Did you know that volunteer hours makes you competitive in the job market? Adding volunteer work to your resume can often showcase your skills, ability to work on a team, and innovation. It's hard to gain that experience AND go to school, so volunteer and get credit at the same time!
