## **Programming or Service Highlights:**

- Three Student Voice Projects presented in collaboration with faculty, staff, students, and ACE
- Increase in students' with families attending programs

- Successful second year of Student Senate restructure, which aligned senators with SLCC school and intentional interaction with the Deans.
  - Student Senate was successful because they continued in strengthening relationships with the dean's and associate dean's by helping solve issues and provide student input.
  - The Senator over the School of Health Sciences and he was in constant contact with his Dean's and Associate Dean's. He worked with the different departments within his school to help create a schedule for maintenance of the study room in the JHS, and also worked with the South Region to provide a new microwave for the room for the students.
- The Student Senate was also successful in finally setting up the Guaranteed Buy Back Plan. They have begun getting signatures from departments to have books some books be guaranteed buy backs for the next two to three years. They will continue working with the rest of the departments over the summer to get more signatures for additional books.
- Hosted the Power of One Conference, a NASPA Region V LGBTQ conference for student leaders April 3-5. There were 180 attendees from 24 institutions in the regional west.

**Assessment Highlights:**

- Three students participating in the Washington, D.C. internship program
- Awarded 52 out of 125 students applying for Book Scholarship
- Awarded 10 out of 27 students applying for the Single Parent Appreciation Scholarship
- Added 15 new clubs, which exhausted allocated yearly funding
- Presented 25 StrengthsQuest workshops as requested by faculty, 75 presented for students
