- Student Code of Conduct/Behavioral Intervention Team. There were 133 recorded student contacts related to Student Code of Conduct and/or BIT issues, supporting 28 individual students.
- The Pathways Transition Program, providing support for recent graduates of Horizonte Instruction and Training Center who choose to attend Salt Lake Community College, supported 15 Horizonte Instruction and Training Center graduates in the program this year.
- Pathways Transition Program employed a VISTA volunteer this year. Her primary function was to develop a Mentor Training program and manual for use in strengthening these activities going forward.
- Horizonte Instruction and Training Center entered into a formal contract with SLCC to provide reimbursement for a dedicated Coordinator who has worked exclusively with college-bound Horizonte students, helping to both recruit and prepare them for enrollment with Salt Lake Community College upon their successful graduation from high school.
- At the request of Horizonte Instruction and Training Center, space was made available at the South City Campus where the High School held a 6-week college preparation class. 25 current Horizonte students participated in the class; each has been awarded a Horizonte Scholarship to attend Salt Lake Community College by fall 2014.
- The Department of Workforce Services continues to support a contract which provides reimbursement for the full-time services of a college employee who works in the LYFE (Lifting Youth to Future Employment) program at the Department of Workforce Services. Many of these young people are in turn referred to Horizonte Instruction and Training Center for high school completion.
- At the request of the Department of Workforce Services, facilitated the founding of a student Club specifically directed toward the support of students who were refugees: United Student Association: A Better Vision The purpose of the club is to promote collaboration between refugee and traditional students, building connections, and facilitating services to help students who are refugees succeed in higher education.
