Assessment Highlights:

- Worked with Facilities, IT, and multiple entities within Student Affairs on South City Campus Student Affairs remodel, from planning to occupation with no disruption of services.
- Participated in Westpointe expansion planning work group, including identifying need for Student Affairs functions and planning appropriate space for Student Affairs, Site Support, IT, Auxiliary Services, etc.
- In response to LSC Student Satisfaction survey, worked with Auxiliary Services to make OneCard order and pick up services available at LSC and explored food options, including making a list of restaurants (including hours of service and ordering, dining and delivery options) within a two block radius of campus.
- In conjunction with South Region and the Office of the Registrar and Academic Records, evaluated effectiveness of monthly ORAR/Regional Staff meetings and made appropriate adjustments to support knowledge acquisition and interpersonal relationships among staff at TRC and Sites.
- Completed Deep Six project, which involved lengthy exploration of the SAT Admissions/Enrollment process and where possible, aligning it with the SLCC Undergraduate process.
- Explored reasons for changing enrollment patterns at SCC, including initiating a student survey and working with the Dean of the School of Arts and Communication and the Director and Coordinator of Site Planning and Support to improve student pathways to program completion.
