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Programming or Service Highlights:

- Overall attendance at Orientation *increased* in the 2016-2017 academic year by 12% from last year, but it is still a 10% decrease from two years ago.
- Over the last three years, the percentage of students completing a NetConnect Orientation has gradually increased from 68% in 2015, to 70% in the last year, to 72% this year. Given this trend, a major overhaul of the online orientation has begun, making great investments on the future of our online orientation.
- The number and percentage of students who persist from fall-to-spring semester has gradually increased from 66% retention in 2015, to 68% last year, to an all-time high of 69% this year!
- Welcome week activities continue to grow and expand. Reaching over 584 new students annually and expanding to the West Valley Center.
- Our FYE cohort programs underwent a restructure. The Bridge to Success program became a prerequisite for all of our cohort programs and common requirements were adopted across all cohort programs.
- This year a two-day orientation was piloted with students from Granite School District. In partnership with Admissions, FYE staff visited the nine Granite School District high schools on day 1, and students were bussed to SLCC for day 2 of this orientation. Over 280 students participated in day one, and of those 223 students participated in day two.
- Advisors continued to present Accuplacer Tips and Tricks Workshops to admitted and continuing students, finding a niche after orientation sessions targeting students who are not able to register for classes due to missing test scores. Approximately 381 of students participated in this workshop.
- DegreeWorks workshops were piloted this year targeting 1st year students. FYE advisors worked collaboratively with EDU 1020 faculty to teach new students how to use DegreeWorks to audit their progress and to create their degree completion plan.
- A West Valley Center Common Intellectual Experience was piloted with 20 students and with support from West Valley Center faculty and staff.

Assessment Highlights:

• This year we completed the Program Review self-study and site visit. As a result of this process, ten goals were created as part of a robust strategic and departmental action plan.
