TRIO Student Support Services Program Highlights

- Alicia Buxton accepted the TRIO SSS Program Advisor position and began on January 3, 2017.
- Conducted 13 campus visits for 34 program participants during 2016-2017 to present with more visits to occur Summer 2017.
- Restructured staff schedules to provide drop in advising to increase flexibility for students.

Due to Ken Stonebrook by July 1, 2017

- Incorporated the use of technology for workshop participation (Scholarship Days, Academies).
- Collaborated with Markosian Library, Student Employment and Career Services, and University of Utah Office of Equity and Diversity for enhanced presentations for the TRIO Academies.
- TRIO SSS Staff completed the Office of Sponsored Projects Grant Training.
- Developed and conducted a series of math workshops which included: getting and staying organized, reading math textbooks, taking notes in math, creating flash cards, finding resources, using calculators, studying for quizzes, communicating with instructors, organizing effective study groups, overcoming math anxiety, and staying motivated.
- Provided 32 presentations in math, biology, education, and English classes.
- Conducted 5 training workshops for Peer Mentors and Academy Leaders which included Planning and Executing Cooperative Events, Communication, Values Identification, Inclusivity and Diversity, and Leadership Vision.
- Participated in TRIO/Student Support Services specific Starfish Training.
- Presented at High School Counselor Conference held at SLCC.
- Partnered with Utah Highway Patrol to provide training for safety on and off campus.
- Provided individual support to 71 students with completion of FAFSA to respond to changes made by Department of Ed.
- Advocated for 22 students transferring to the University of Utah to obtain admission fee and tuition down payment waivers.
- Staffed information tables at various SLCC events such as Welcome Back, Explore SLCC and Granite District Fee Waiver Days.
- For the 2015-2016 Annual Program Performance Report (APR), the TRIO/SSS Program earned the maximum number of Prior Experience (PE) points of 15.

TRIO STEM Program Highlights

- The TRIO STEM Program Manager completed the first TRIO STEM Scholars' Orientation on August 19, 2016 in partnership with the SLCC School of Science, Mathematics, & Engineering Dean Craig Caldwell.
- Two TRIO STEM program participants were speakers at the opening ceremony highlighting the renovations of the Dumke STEM Learning Center (March 1, 2017).
- The first annual Bruin Brains student research conference had over 100 students, staff and faculty attend (March 24, 2017), which was planned and facilitated by TRIO STEM program participants.
- 15 TRIO STEM students presented undergraduate research for the first time.
- 5 TRIO STEM students attended the National American Chemical Society Conference in San Francisco, 2 placed with awards.
- 3 TRIO STEM students won awards during the SLCC SME Symposium.
- A TRIO STEM student was selected for an elite internship with the U.S. Department of Energy.
- A TRIO STEM student was selected as a McNair Scholar at Westminster College.
- 24 TRIO STEM students were awarded the \$10,000 STEM Scholars award.
- TRIO STEM worked with Expanding Our Horizons to promote females in STEM.

- The TRIO STEM Program Manager received the staff association award.
- The TRIO STEM advisor graduated from the University of Utah with a Master's degree in Educational Leadership and Policy focusing on Latina/o students in higher education.
- TRIO STEM Peer mentors hosted 45 PACE students and presented three STEM workshops during a campus visit.
- TRIO STEM partnered with BSU, LIA and PUA for their annual high school conferences.
- TRIO STEM presented on inclusive social justice frameworks during both state and regional ASPIRE conferences.

TRIO Programs' Department Highlights

- The TRIO Programs staff of the TRIO STEM Program Manager and the Director of TRIO Programs of SSS & STEM, along with the SLCC Dean of SME collaborated with the team from the University of Utah that successfully completed each phase of the grant application competition of the Howard Hughes Medical Institute (HHMI) where only 24 applications were awarded out of 511.
- Finalized Program Review Plan of Action for TRIO Programs of SSS & STEM (Spring 2017).
- Updated TRIO Programs of SSS & STEM website (Spring 2017).
- All TRIO Programs of ETS (College Bound), SSS, & STEM hosted the annual TRIO Day observation to recognize the service learning component of TRIO program participants in partnership with the Wasatch Community Gardens (March, 1, 2017).
